Hello from the Trips Desk!

The long wait for ski season is finally over! In December, Kate Clinton led a group of intrepid, early bird skiers to Vail. There are good years, and not-so-good years for this pre-Christmas trip, and this year was a VERY good year. Good snow, great location and super participants all added up to a fantastic launch for the Space City ski trip slate. Then, as soon as the Christmas decorations were put away, it was time for the TSC Traditional trip to Snowmass. Another fantastic trip, with something for every skier. If you like blue bird days, they had 'em. If you like freshies, there were a couple of days of excellent powder. And all packaged up with the parties and festivities expected in a TSC trip.

Next up are Big Sky and Ischgl. Big Sky is a favorite for our club, with a huge variety of terrain. Lodging is at the Huntley, which includes their HUGE and AMAZING breakfast buffet (be careful, you can eat yourself into a food coma!) Ischgl, located in the Tyrolean Alps in Austria, is the TSC Winter Expedition trip destination. Skiers will enjoy terrain that accommodates all skill levels. 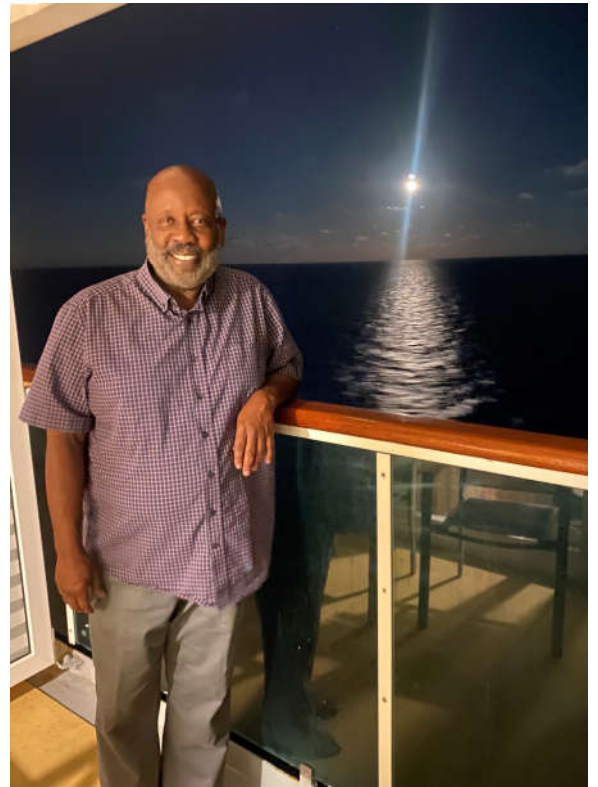
Sorrell Warren

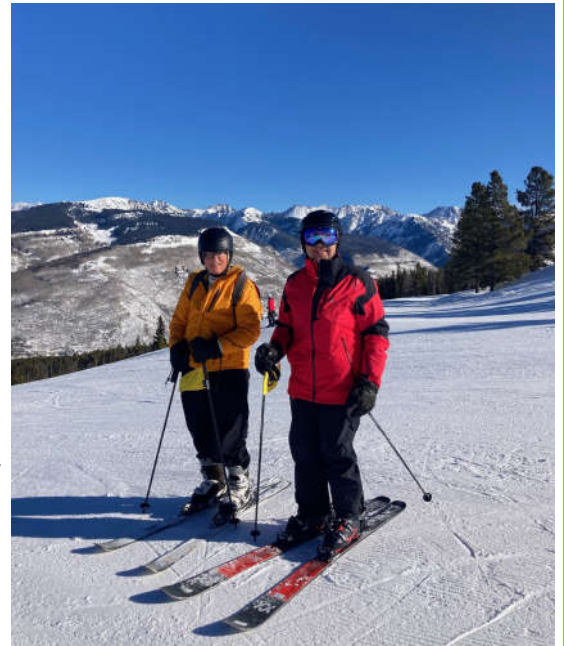
SCSC Vail December 2022 Ski Trip

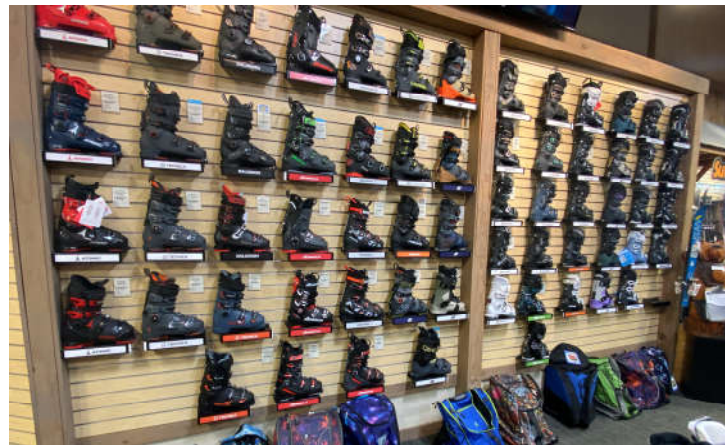
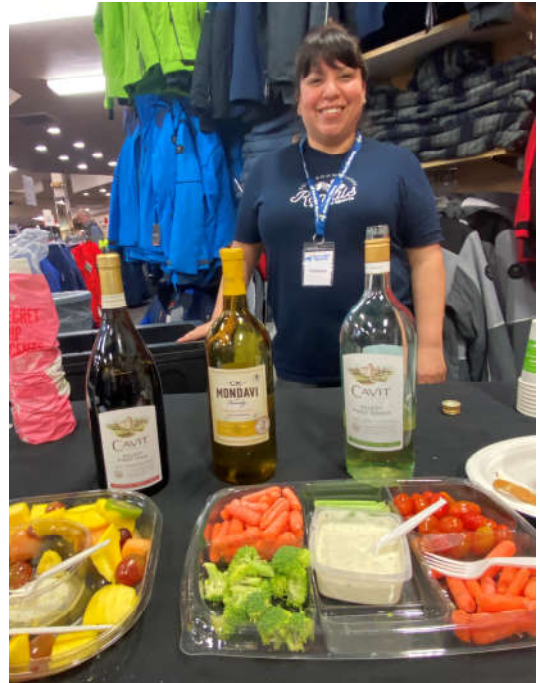
