PROTECTIVE HELMETS

The Importance of Wearing a Helmet When Skiing

You have probably noticed significantly more people are wearing helmets on the ski slopes these days than 10 years ago. Research has proven that while helmets don't necessarily prevent head injuries, they do significantly reduce the severity of those injuries. If you aren't yet wearing a helmet when you ski, now may be the time to invest in one.

Data reported from the National Ski Areas Association (NSAA) reveals that about 40 people have died each

year skiing or snowboarding during the last decade. In 2008, that is a fatality rate of about 3.9 per 1 million participants on the slopes. Research has shown that the likelihood of death from an accident on the slopes is decreased if a helmet is worn.

What Needs to be Done

Research shows that the injuries participants sustain during recreational snowboarding and skiing activities can cause significant levels of morbidity and mortality among those who enjoy participating in snow sports. The most significant cause of hospitalization from snowboarding and skiing crashes is traumatic head injury.

A study at Johns Hopkins revealed that none of the theories that helmets increase risky behavior or increase the odds of neck or cervical spine injuries are valid. Instead, it shows that a helmet can prevent death and decrease the severity of the trauma experienced.

Because the research shows that participants who wear helmets are more likely to suffer less serious head injuries, the Eastern Association for the Surgery of Trauma recommends that all skiers and snowboarders wear helmets when participating in alpine sports. Several other medical organizations are also following suit and making the same recommendation.

Setting an Example

If more adults would wear helmets on the slopes, it would set a good example for children. When children see the adult skiers and snowboarders wearing protective helmets, they are going to be more likely to wear helmets when they are participating in alpine sports. By doing this, more people would be wearing protective headgear on the slopes and severity of injuries and the number of deaths would decrease significantly.

Looking at the Numbers

The argument regarding the effectiveness of helmets was revived after the death of Natasha Richardson in 2009 after she suffered a fall on a Canadian ski slope that later resulted in her death. The director of Johns Hopkins' Center for Surgical Trials and Outcomes Research said that Richardson's death could have been prevented. She wasn't wearing a helmet when at low speed she tumbled backwards on a bunny slope for beginners. He said that with a helmet, the blow to the head wouldn't have been lethal. While there are many reasons to wear a helmet, your #1 reason should be to protect your life.

*This article was not written by a legal professional, and it is always your own choice to use a helmet when you ski. Just keep in mind that if you do wear a helmet, you may be saving lives.

COUNTDOWN TO LIFTOFF

This pass allows the holder to ski up to 5 days at each of the 39 resorts, so it isn't unlimited like the Epic pass but enough days to plan a week long trip.

Watch your email in late February for the 2018 ski trip survey. This survey will be used to decide what slate of ski trips to offer next season. In addition to the above trips I will be looking for input on other popular locations like: Snowmass, Sun Valley, Jackson Hole and other suggested locations. My goal is to offer trips that seem to have the most interest for the most members plus at least a few from TheMaxPass. Because club trips will have an equal chance against winning TSC trips, we might not participate in all TSC trips offered next season.

I want to thank the 119 members who participated in

the Non-Ski Trip Survey. I have finished evaluating the results and will be sending out a summary once I get Executive Committee approval. Watch your email accounts!

The results showed a strong support for more Non-Ski trips and we will be trying to provide some additional trips soon. Only 9 people offered to run these trips, so I hope once we can get some more specifics about trips we will have a few more people throw their names into the hat. There was a near unanimous request to have daily optional activities, so a lot of planning will be required. It won't be like a ski trip where we just hand everybody a lift ticket and say have fun.
