

## COUNTDOWN TO LIFTOFF

Hi all! As you read this our last ski trip of the season will be returning from Telluride on Saturday Mar 4<sup>th</sup>. We had a great year with over 200 participants on six ski trips. Not included in this number are those from Space City that are participating in The Texas Ski Council Youth Foundation trip at Keystone on March 12<sup>th</sup> to 16<sup>th</sup>. Cindy Moore coordinated this trip



for the Youth Foundation and is taking 54 participants, most of whom are going with Space City. Our strong showing indicates that we need to push the Youth Foundation to continue these types of trips or consider having Space City run similar family optional trips in the future.

As Bill mentioned, we are in short supply of volunteers, and we will be looking for ways to revise our business model, but we still need Trip Leaders for every trip. With innovative ideas, we should be able to reduce the workload of volunteers, but we still will need people to guide each trip. We increased the number of spots sold this season by over 100. But we can't keep offering this many trips if we don't get people volunteering to run the trips. We want to keep up this positive trend but we need to get people to step-up and agree to run them. Please send your applications in ASAP (attachment at the end of this Sitzmarke) or send an email to [trips@spacecity.org](mailto:trips@spacecity.org).

As you saw this year's strategy was to feature resorts that honored the Local Epic pass. This allowed some to reduce their lift ticket costs and take multiple trips. For those that didn't buy the season pass the advantages weren't as obvious but here was the logic. Getting members to take multiple trips with the club allowed us to meet our minimum levels per trip and keep trip prices down.

Believe it or not, we are now at the key stage of our planning window for next season and we need your crucial input on how many trips and which ones to offer. To keep a variety of destinations we are planning to feature a different season pass for the 2017-2018 season. We have mentioned it before and details can be seen at the following link: [TheMaxPass.com](http://TheMaxPass.com). Here is a short list of the 39 resorts that are part of this pass: Big Sky, Steamboat, Copper Mt, Winter Park, Mt Bachelor, Solitude, Brighton, Crested Butte, Fernie, Kimberly, Kicking Horse and Alyeska. This pass isn't unlimited days like the Epic Pass but with 5-days per resort, it is enough to plan a few week long trips.

Before we can plan to feature TheMaxPass we need to understand if there is enough interest in these 39 resorts. We also need to know which and how many TSC trips the majority are interested in taking. This is needed before the upcoming TSC Trip Meeting on April 7<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup>.

To make sure your voice is heard, answer the trip survey that will be sent to everybody in the next week. We know everybody can't make it to San Antonio, so make sure you answer the survey promptly and your vote will still be counted.

For those wanting to come to San Antonio for the Annual TSC Trip meeting, it is being held on April 7<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> at the Drury Inn-Riverwalk. The Deadline to reserve a hotel room at the reduced rate of (\$147 or \$157) per night is March 13<sup>th</sup>. The registration fee is again only \$75 and includes the following and more: attendance to the presentations, vendor ski show, Saturday lunch and dinner, access to the silent auction plus the traditional TSC dance. (Flyer is included in this Sitzmarke.)

Macksoud and Epic Mix medalists Patti Tribou and Barrett Clarke.


