## Countdown to Liftoff

The ski season has zoomed by faster than Lindsey Vonn on a downhill race course! The Breckenridge TSC trip is currently "on the slopes". After that the only remaining snow ski trip will be the family-friendly Winter Park Spring Break trip in March. Wow, was that fast!!!

We are currently accepting registrations for both the May 9 to 16, 2015 trip to Mexico's Riviera Maya (<u>Riviera Maya Trip Article</u>) and the Oct 29 to Nov 7, 2015 Discover Tuscany, Italy trip (<u>Discover Tuscany Trip Article</u>).

Remember the research and effort you spent deciding which ski boots and which skis to purchase? It is now time to protect the investment you made in your ski equipment and store it properly. Someone working at a ski resort and skiing several hundred days a year will wear out a pair of ski boots in one season. Most Space City members are not skiing that many days in a year so we need to make sure to properly store our ski boots so they are in good shape for many, many seasons. For my ski boots, I remove the liners and the foot bed from the shell. I leave everything out in the open for a few days to make sure everything is completely dry and then reassemble the boots. If you have any concern that you have not assembled your boots correctly, try putting the boot on your foot. You will know immediately if you have everything correctly assembled. When you are ready to store them, buckle the ski boots loosely so they hold their shape. Now you need to find the right place in your house to store your boots. Heat and humidity can damage your ski boots and skis, so that eliminates the garage! If you have an interior closet that stays cool or a closet with an AC

vent, that is the perfect place for your ski boots. You also need to correctly store your skis. It is a good idea to have your skis tuned and waxed at the end of the season. If you tell the ski shop you are done for the year, they will leave a heavy layer of wax on the ski bottoms. The first time you ski next year, you can either scrap off the extra wax or just ignore that it is there and start skiing. The extra wax will come off without too much of a problem. After you pick the low heat/low humidity place in your house to store your skis, be sure and put your bindings in the "ski" position. That is the position your binding would be if you were standing on them ready to ski. Be careful when moving the heel piece to the "ski" position. The springs are very strong and you could injure your hands if they get in the way of your heel piece going into the ski position.

Even though this year's snowfall has not yet begun to melt, it is now time to start planning for the 2015-2016 trips. If there are no trip coordinators, there are no trips! If you are interested in being an ATC or TC on a ski club trip next season, please complete the TC ATC Application form included in this newsletter (page 19). You can also download the form from the SCSC website.


## Trip Report - Beaver Creek






## Member Profile – Laura Nowicki

s much as I loved living in "Ski Country" (and I did, live there and adore it), here is something interesting I've found in "Not Ski Country" - Houston. Houston skiers have interesting stories of how they learned to ski. When you live in Ski Country most people grew up skiing at a nearby mountain. Skiers who live in Houston not only learned it somewhere you may not have heard of but have to be passionate to keep going—skiing that is.

They have to plan for this, sometimes as much as 8 months, save up their money, and keep those knees in shape somehow.

I met Laura Nowicki on the Garmisch trip last year. I was delighted to learn that we would both be on the Madesimo journey last month. As I had requested in a previous member profile, someone on the trip slipped me a note to say "interview Laura Nowicki." So, I did.

Her family lived near Anchorage, Alaska at Fort Richardson Army Base from 1969 to 1971 when she was in junior high school. The military had a ski recreation area for active military and their families called Arctic Valley.

The military supplied Duece and a Quarters

(troop transport trucks) to take the kids up to the Arctic Valley. There were no windows and skis were piled up in the middle. The scene was a mass of kids going skiing and really cold because the trucks were not heated. There were usually four trucks a day and the military drivers picked them up and dropped them off at the Rec Center. There was a rumor that a previous truck had overturned "so the kids were nervous but you wanted to be cool so you didn't act afraid. I still remember the sound of the chains rumbling up the mountain." They could buy season lift tickets for \$15 or rent skis and get a



lift ticket for \$1 per day. She saved up and finally got her first pair of skis with babysitting money. They were Daiwa skis and they had the newest technology to prevent runaway skis instead of the old school "leash" around the ankles. They were let out of school on Wednesdays for half days of skiing. The military side of Arctic Valley had two rope tows and a Poma lift. The civilian side had a chair lift but the lift tickets were more expensive so she never rode it. The slopes had no grooming so they were always full of moguls.



Look at her now - silver ski jacket and a bamboo trimmed helmet. She leads the Macarena and organizes the Bridge competitions when she's resting from skiing on our trips. Oh, let's not forget that she and Jim have hosted the trip Post Party for the second year in a row. Now that takes courage!

Current Arctic Valley lift tickets are \$35 for adults and \$15 for children and the mountain is staffed with volunteers. Now that is Ski Country. I hope we are together on another ski trip, Laura. She is at the center of things whether she is leading the Macarena or on the floor—it's all good!
