Monday morning at 10 a.m. the mountain provided another mountain tour and two of our participants went on the tour. The group lunch was at Canyon Lodge, and Marsha Lutz, Marda Waters, Lisa Wilson, Davis

Tucker, Stuart Traver, Diane and Dave Stotz all attended. Our après-ski was at the Talon Bar at Eagle Lodge. We had an optional group dinner at the Mammoth Rock Brasserie, which happens to be in the Mammoth Rock 'N' Bowl Bowling Alley. French chef Freddie Pierrel came out to our table to introduce himself. We ended up running into him at two more bars during the week. That was definitely the best food I've ever had at a bowling alley!

On Tuesday the group had a choice to either do a tour of June Lake Loop, Mono Lake and Bodie Ghost Town, or stay at Mammoth and ski. Sarah Granbery, Marsh Lutz, Lisa Wilson, Marda Waters, Stuart Traver and Diane & David Stotz all

went on the tour. Everyone else stayed in Mammoth and skied. If you stayed at Mammoth that day you had the opportunity to practice on the race course.

June Lake Loop was spectacular, and we even saw Silver Lake where a scene from the movie "Oblivion" with Tom Cruise was filmed.

Mono Lake was EERIE. It is an alkali, salty lake, with no outfall. It loses all of its water due to evaporation. The City of Los Angeles has been taking water from the streams that feed Mono Lake for years, so its volume has shrunk dramatically. In order to save the lake and the many bird species that live on an







island in the center of the lake, a court has ruled that Los Angeles must drastically cut down on the water that they take from the lake. The high level of alkalinity has caused limestone structures called "Tufa" to be formed under the water of the lake. As the lake has shrunk, the Tufa has become exposed.

Next was Bodie Ghost Town. We had a quick sandwich at the parking lot and then went on our guided tour of the town. Our tour guide was Terri Geissinger, who works for the Bodie Foundation. She actually lives in the ghost town, along with 4 park rangers. She gave us a fantastic tour of the old mining town, one of the only preserved mining



towns in the world. Her whole life work is dedicated to researching all she can about the history of Bodie.

After returning from Bodie, several people chose to go to dinner at The Restaurant at Convict Lake. The lake was named after an incident on September 23, 1871, where a group of convicts escaped from prison in Carson City. They were recaptured at Convict Lake.

Wednesday was TSC Club Race Day. The race course was set up on the lower half of the Andy's Double Gold run. Seven Space City people signed up to race, and with a little cajoling all seven raced. We'll get to the

race results later. The group lunch was scheduled at Eleven53 Café, but it was closed so we had lunch at McCoy's instead.
The TSC Pub Crawl started at 6 pm, and all 13 of our group attended. We went to six different bars: Mammoth Brewing Company, Clocktower Cellar at the Alpenhof Lodge, Campo, Gomez Restaurant and Tequilera, Smokeyard BBQ, and Lakanuki. The club





consensus seemed to be that Lakanuki was the most fun, but that might have been the adult beverages talking!

Back to skiing on Thursday, with a group lunch at the Yodler. This is a cool Swiss chalet that was purchased and dismantled in Switzerland and reassembled in Mammoth!

George Dawson and Nelson Messinger who all rode up Spluga Pass right into Switzerland.




Member Profile – Steve Ying

met Steve Ying on one of my first events with the Space City Ski Club, at a kayaking event. There was a large group of us and Steve spent the first hour organizing the group while running back and forth trying to round up more kayaks. He

would speak to us and then hop on a truck, hang on the side of it, all the while yelling while it was trying to pull out to go somewhere. When he returned he had more kayaks. I later found out that he had expected 12 participants and 40 showed up! All I knew was that he was constantly moving, attending to each person's needs and ultimately everyone ended up with a kayak.

I couldn't wait to find out more about him. He said that for most of his childhood he lived across the street from a small ski slope called Boyce Park Ski Area in Monroeville, PA, a suburb of Pittsburgh. It's really small: 160' vertical. In fact it's so small that even lift tickets today are only \$10. I wouldn't mind that right now! His parents thought the sport was too dangerous so they never allowed him to ski.

In the winter of 1976, his senior year in high school, he was hanging out in the area where kids smoked, talking to a classmate who was upset that his lame parents bought him ski equipment for Christmas. The kid was willing to trade all his new ski equipment for an ounce of smokeable material. Steve was




confident he had made a good deal since an ounce was only worth \$20 back in those days. The next day Steve received the equipment and headed straight for Boyce, and so......a star is born! When he told his parents that night, surprisingly they weren't upset. They had to agree that skiing was a much better activity than smoking and also agreed that he made a good deal. It turned out that his dad could buy discounted lift tickets for \$4 at work at a slightly larger nearby ski area called Seven Springs. His father got everyone he knew to buy up their employee allotment for his son.

For the next four years at Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, Steve had unlimited lift tickets. He skied at Seven Springs 2-3 times a week at night after classes. It wasn't until four years later as a senior that he was able to ski during the day. That winter of his senior year he headed to Colorado so he could do more daylight skiing. He bought a 30-day Ameripass on Greyhound which

allowed him to travel anywhere in the country. It was a bad snow season that year, so after several days of skiing, he decided to put his bus pass to the test and travel around. Steve said that is when he learned that a bad season in the West is way better than a good season in the East. He has never taken a ski lesson. A true self-made man!

Steve eventually ended up in Texas. The thing he remembered most about that trip was that the most beautiful girls in the country lived in Texas. After graduation he moved to Houston and has been here ever since.

Like many of us transplants, he didn't give up skiing just because he was in Houston. I think it becomes just another challenge for us. During the 80's before the internet dominated the airline reservation business, Continental Airlines had a hub at the old Stapleton Airport in Denver. He had a travel agent friend who could often find cheap last minute





Even after marriage and children, he kept skiing. He was on a trip to Ski Apache in Ruidoso in 1992 with his oldest daughter Laura, who was 7 months

old at the time. After arriving he found out they didn't have day-care for infants, so he had to stuff her in his backpack to ski. Now that's what I call a real man! Laura is 23 now and despite growing up in Houston, she is a great snowboarder.

According to Steve "When it comes to that never-ending après-ski debate about the emergence of snowboards, unlike most old skiers, I am pro-snowboard. I feel it is saving our industry. That reminds me of a story about my younger daughter, Allie, who like most teenagers was a snowboarder. It was March 2008 and as usual, we were headed to Colorado for Spring Break when I heard the news that Hell was about to freeze over because Taos was going to start allowing snowboarding. So we abruptly changed plans and headed to Taos. The only hitch was that the kids had to rent skis for the first couple days of that week before the Epic Day. The night before they opened the slopes up for snowboarding, Allie told me she didn't want to board. I couldn't believe my ears after driving 18 hours to get there. But she quickly calmed my anger by telling me she didn't want to ride, she wanted to ski. She said that after skiing the bumps, the glades and the double blacks with her old Dad, she remembered how much fun it was. She said she never could have done that on a board. That was probably the greatest day of my adult-skiing life. Allie is 21 now and surpassed her old man on the slopes years ago."

Steve joined the Space City Ski Club in 2008 and has been taking 2 or 3 trips a year with the Club ever since. He says he can't believe that it took him so long to find this really great group of skier friends in Houston. Steve enjoys the camaraderie and was the ATC for Jackson Hole (his personal favorite ski resort) last year and most recently was the TC for

Breckenridge this year. Snow skiing is his favorite activity. "I still love pounding the bumps - the steeper the better. I find it totally exhilarating to fly down a mountain at 50 mph with no engine. I also like kayaking, inline skating and backpacking, which I think is a great way to enjoy the mountains when there is no snow. There is something that I do love more than skiing - I love my daughters and my soon-to-be wife Jeanne-Marie. She's not a skier but she is very supportive. I just finished my 40th ski season and am looking forward to the next 40 years on the slopes."

If you haven't met Steve, he and Jeanne-Marie will be cooking at the Crawfish Boil. He informed me that crawfish is an Asian-Cajun specialty so he and Jeanne-Marie will be in harmony with their heritage and I know we are in for a real treat.
