



## FROM THE SKI DESK









## HOT AIR BALLOONING AND SKY DIVING - MARCH 8 GENERAL MEETING

Two high-adventure sports were featured at March 8 General Meeting were Hot Air Ballooning and Sky Diving. Those in attendance thoroughly enjoyed the presentations of four highly experienced and technical speakers, which included a video, photos, and equipment of their sports. So many inquisitive questions were asked by the audience that one would think they were ready for lessons!



Dick Carter and Ann Kirby, the prior president of the Lone Star Hot Air Balloon Association, discussed opportunities to join their club, join a ballooning crew the day, for navigation, what

activities around Houston relate to hot air ballooning, the Ballunar Event at NASA each August, and the history of the sport. The history began when man's first attempt to fly was in a hot air balloon. On November 21, 1783 in Annonay, France, the first balloon was launched using heat created by an open fire. Later, ballooning was thought to have a military application but that was soon abandoned and it became recreational. It was not until the 1960s when the development of safer burner and equipment came into being that ballooning took off as a sport. Today with the availability of lightweight and strong fabric and material, balloons are as simple or as complex as the imagination.

Ballooning is a team sport requiring a minimum of 2 people besides the pilot to assemble, launch, fly and pack up. Balloons fly at sunrise or just before sunset as that is when the wind is the most stable. A morning flight is followed by breakfast with other pilots and crews, making hot air ballooning not only an adventure but a great way to meet new friends. During the principal flying season, May through November, groups from Houston travel around the neighboring states to participate in rallies.




