

During the Keystone Trip, I sadly report that we had an injury. Over the years, all of us have been on a trip where one of our participant has sustained an injury.

Several years ago I was one of the people injured on a trip. I had a tumbling fall, my bindings did not release, and it tore my ACL. After reconstructive surgery on my knee and

months of physical therapy, I am a proponent of safety first.

In case you are not familiar with the **Skier/Boarder Responsibility Code**, here it is:

SKIER/BOARDER RESPONSIBILITY CODE:

- 1. Always stay in control, and be able to stop or avoid other people or objects.
- 2. People ahead of you have the right of way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
- 3. You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
- 4. Whenever starting downhill or merging into a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
- 5. Always use devices to help prevent runaway equipment.
- 6. Observe all posted signs and warnings. Keep off closed trails and out of closed areas.
- 7. Prior to using any lift, you must have the knowledge and ability to load, ride and unload safely.

KNOW THE CODE. IT'S YOUR RESPONSIBILITY.

Some additional safety suggestions are:

- If you are a beginner, take lessons before you try to go up a lift..

- Pay attention to your equipment. Be sure your bindings release properly.
- Be sure you are dressed in warm clothing that does not restrict your movement.
- Don't go out of bounds.
- Don't ski alone. Try to find someone else that skis at your level.
- If you ski alone, let someone know where you are going and when you plan to return.
- Keep hydrated. The altitude can get the best of you, hydration is your best defense.

IN CASE OF INJURY ON THE MOUNTAIN:

- 1. Remain calm
- 2. Check the A,B,C's: airways, breathing and circulation.
- 3. Do not remove the injured person's skis or snowboard.
- 4. Do not move the injured person unless you are trained to do so. Keep the injured person still.
- 5. Cross your own skis uphill from the incident.
- 6. Send someone to the nearest lift or open building to report the location, type of injury, and description of the injured skier.
- 7. Keep the injured person warm.

YOUR LAST RUN OF THE DAY

Most accidents happen when you are tired. End the day on a positive note. Stop skiing with the first signs of fatigue. Use caution walking in the buildings and parking lots. Melting and freezing, as well as water accumulation, can cause surfaces to become slippery.

Stay safe, have fun, be happy, and enjoy the beauty of nature around you.




