Tournament will be held on April 17th with AC, Steven Teoh and a Golf Tournament on April 25 with AC, Jeff Sarffl



To give some history, Brian was on a business trip to Boston in June 1997. A waiter at dinner told Brian and his wife, **Natalie**, that he had just run the Boston Marathon and

Brian signed up for Houston Fit, thinking that he would run the Houston Marathon in January, qualify for the Boston, and then go back to Boston in April.

Well, as most of you know, the goal of running a marathon in 3 hours 30 minutes proved to be more difficult than he thought! It took him six years of training, including running three marathons in Houston, one in Austin and two in Dallas.

Brian enjoyed the day watching the runners go by, and reflecting back on the days that he too, was a runner. 
