

The ski season for the ski club is fast approaching. You gotta get ready. Beginning August 15, 2003 and ending August 30, 2003 the club will hold mail in sign_up. Appearing in the July and August issues of the Sitzmarke is the form you need to use in order to take advantage of the earliest opportunity to sign up for the ski trips of your choice. Yeah, yeah, I know it is really difficult to get your mindset into the ski mode, but remember, you live in Houston, Texas and there are no mountains here and there is no snow here, you won't be able to throw your skis in to the back of your SUV and head out to the mountains at a moment's notice. Sure, you can still be a ski nut and if you plan it really, really carefully you can put in as many or more ski days than your friends that live in the Rockies, but to do that you gotta have a plan and you gotta plan early. Last weekend when I was sweating, getting roasted in the heat and the mosquitoes were taking what was left of my dignity, I found that I had plenty of motivation to get mentally prepared and organized so that I would be able to maximize my mountain time and maximize my vertical feet tally this winter. So this sweaty little snow bunny is gonna be ready and is gonna be sure to get in on the best trips, using the least vacation time and the least dollars per vertical foot of that fluffy white powder and I am gonna do it with the ski club's mail in sign-up procedure and you can do it too.

First, read all the trip articles, check out the dates and the prices then pull out the mail in sign-up form. Fill in one form for each trip you want. This means you will have to make extra copies of the form, or download extras from the website. Up to two people can use one form, and can write one check for both deposit amounts but each trip requires a separate form and a separate check for deposit. Then wait for August 15, 2003, mail the form and the deposit check to the trip leader at the address shown on the mail in sign-up form and wait for the trip leader to send you an e-mail or call you to confirm that your form and deposit were received. The only thing you gotta remember is don't mail the form until the 15th of August. The trip leader takes the mail in forms in the order they are received and post marked on or after August 15. If the trip leader gets it before the 15th or it is post marked before that date it is put on the bottom of the stack and not included until all the other mail in sign ups are on the trip list first! Yes I know it is cruel, but it is a rule made long ago and you just gotta deal with it. As long as you don't try to jump the gun it is totally that easy!! Isn't it cool that the club makes it so easy to stay on top of being organized?

TSC Fall Roundup

LET THE SKIING BEGIN! The Texas Ski Council for its 2003 Fall Roundup has selected Keystone, Colorado. This is a family optional trip with four full days of skiing.

Our United Airlines flight leaves Bush Intercontinental on Tuesday after 5PM going non-stop to Denver. We travel by motor coach to the Conference Village Condos. These 2-bedroom, 2-bathroom condos are in a peaceful Alpine village setting

surrounding Keystone Lake. All units have fully equipped kitchens, coffee maker, gas or wood-burning fireplace with wood provided, hair dryer, and color TV with HBO. In addition, there is access to a pool, hot tub, and laundry facilities.

Keystone's free shuttle stops at a convenient location to the condos with a 10-minute, "m., ride to the mountain. Your lift ticket also allows skiing at Breckenridge and Arapahoe Basin. With a multi-lift ticket of three or more days, there are limited ski days at Vail and Beaver Creek. Keystone Mountain has 1,861 acres of skiable terrain. There is skiing for all levels – 12% easy, 29% more difficult, 5% advanced, and 54% more difficult. The base elevation at Keystone Mountain is 9,300 ft. with the summit elevation reaching 12,200 ft.; and if nature needs a little boost, the snowmaking operations are one of the largest in North America. Can't get enough skiing during the day? Keystone offers night skiing until 9PM with 17 trails open on 235 acres. The longest run is 3 miles. Adventure Point offers tubing, snowshoeing, snowbiking, and the Summit House Restaurant.

Skiing and snowboarding lessons are available at all levels. For families there are activities for kids. There is a Children's Center and of course a ski school. The teens can play video games, watch movies, and surf the net.

If shopping is more to your taste, there are over a dozen specialty shops in Keystone Village, at the base of Keystone Mountain, and River Run Village at the base of the Gondola. Silverthorne Outlet Mall is a short free shuttle ride away and has approximately 80 factory outlet shops.

Since this is a TSC trip, there will be a welcome party where you have the opportunity to meet people from the other Texas clubs. In addition, there will be a traditional Thanksgiving dinner offered, happy hours and an awards banquet on Saturday night. You can also sign up for NASTAR racing and help to bring the 1st place trophy to Space City.

So if you want to ski, have some great fun, and meet new people, come to Keystone with Christie and me for a memorable Thanksgiving holiday!



So come explore the mountains of Taos with your family or individually over the holidays! Come adopt an adobe abode for a week and enjoy all the area has to offer. You won't be disappointed!



The Art of Mail in Sign-Up and The Fine Print

Mail-in Sign-Up: HERE IT IS! Your chance to get an early spot on your favorite SCSC ski trip(s) for 2003-2004. The mail-in sign-up form is in this issue of the Sitzmarke, so copy it or clip it out and follow the instructions below. Then, wait for the trip TC to notify you if you are on the trip or come to the September meeting to verify your registration, sign the Trip Release Form and pick up additional information the TC will have for you.

1. Mail-in sign-up begins on Friday, August 15 and ends on Saturday, August 30. Your sign-up envelopes must be postmarked on or between these dates. (Registration received with postmarks outside these dates will be held until the September General Meeting. If you visit the trip table you may be added to the trip at that time, (space permitting.)

2. You must be a current member in good standing. In general this means you should have renewed your membership prior to August 1, 2003. Your 2003-2004 membership number should be shown on the mailing label for the August Sitzmarke.

Call your VP of Membership, Gary Barrett, if you have questions.

3. You may sign-up yourself and one other SCSC member per trip (see by-law 2.8.A. in your club directory).

4. In the registration envelope include the trip registration form and your deposit. The deposit for the Chamonix trip is \$300.00 per participant. The deposit on all other trips is \$150 per participant. Checks are to be made payable to "SCSC" and should have your membership number and the TRIP NAME listed on the check.

- 5. Mail your registration to the Address on the Form for the trip on which you wish to participate. TC's names are listed for all trips. For information, telephone numbers and e-mail addresses are listed in this Sitzmarke and on the Trip Registration Form. If your registration is mailed to anyone other than the TC, it will be returned to you and you will not be registered for the trip.
- 6. If the postmark is correct and the registration meets the above guidelines, names will be added to each trip's Participant List in the order received. If a trip's participant roster fills during mail-in sign-up, additional registrations received will be added to a Wait List in the order received. The TC will hold checks for wait-listed members until a space becomes available on the trip. For the participants that are on trips, the checks will be deposited on or after August 19th.

7. These procedures apply to ALL members (except the trip's TC and ATC) and all Trip Participants are subject to SCSC

Standing Rules, Policies and Procedures.

- 8. SCSC is not responsible for any problems with the U.S. Postal Service, including delayed delivery or lost mail.
- 9. Information shown on the Trip Schedule is subject to change. Contact the TC or ATC for up-to-date information

10. Any registrations received, which do not meet the above qualifications, may be returned to the sender.

Land Packages: The Executive Committee has approved Land Packages on this year's trips. On the trips which there are a limited number of land packages available, if all are filled, you will be given the option of being on a "Land Wait List" or switching to a full package.

Because of the restrictions noted below for land packages, be sure you have concrete travel arrangements made before you sign up for one of these. SCSC will not be responsible for any difficulties or extra expense you incur due to delayed or canceled flights or other transportation problems.

Rules and restrictions for Land Packages

1. The price of the land package will be the full trip price minus participant's airfare. Ground transportation will be included and available, on selected trips, to land package participants if they can meet the group at the destination airport on time. Ground transportation will not be delayed for land package participants arriving later than the group.

2. Other than the full package, this is the only package price available; no other combinations of lodging and/or transportation will be offered. (Note: As in the past, members may still arrange their own transportation, lodging, etc., and pay only for the

parties and trip options. If so, please arrange to do this in advance, ideally by the pre-trip party.)

3. Normal cancellation and transfer policies apply — with the added stipulation that, on or after final payment date, land package participants must be replaced from a land package wait list and full package participants must be replaced from a full package wait list in order to transfer or receive a refund.

4. Be sure this is the package you want -- It may not be possible to convert your trip from land package to full package, or vice

versa. The Club may not be able to secure additional airline seats.

5. If you sign up for a land package, please notify the TC of your transportation plans in advance of the trip. The TC can tell you where to meet the group or other pertinent information.
