



- 7.5 No person may participate in a Club sponsored trip, or participant paid activity, without first completing a written and signed Release of Liability for that trip or activity, on a form approved by the Board of Directors.

An Evening of Classical Music



Peacocks were strutting their plumage unofficially guarding the door as I carried an armload of SCSC "stuff" into Vargo's front door about an hour before C-Day (Concert Day). I had envisioned a possible downpour on this night with an unwanted encore of lightening and thunder. Vargo's is situated in such a beautiful scenic setting, and poor weather would have tainted the evening's

atmosphere. However, the "No Snow" gods smiled down on us in, and the weather was beautiful.

The phone had been ringing steadily prior to Tuesday evening wondering if perhaps tickets could be purchased at the door. Vargo's estimated the room capacity at 150+. We were hoping for 100 attendees, although the budget was proposed for 75. I anxiously counted chairs and rearranged the seating in case everyone who called and those who had already purchased tickets actually showed. When the final count was completed, we sold 165 tickets. We had a full house! We were able to raise over \$1,400 for the Sunshine Kids – almost three times what we expected. This included over \$200 in the "Sunshine Kids Tip Jar" when the audience determined (without too much pressure from me) that Walter earned his keep for the evening. I had always told Walter that perhaps someday - instead of having him be a greeter at Wal-Mart - I would drop him off at a "productive" street corner in Houston with a sign "Will Play for \$." This idea may have some merit!

The big day started just after lunch when the piano movers arrived at the office to transport Walter's grand to Vargo's. Carl Schaer, Walter's tuner, arrived at Vargo's shortly after Walter's and Vargo's pianos were placed side-by-side so that he could make sure they would both sound well together. Walter told me later that Carl had generously tuned both pianos free of charge as his contribution to making the evening successful. Had I known this at the time, I would have acknowledged his gift. He had purchased a ticket, so I knew he planned to stay for the evening. Belatedly, we thank him for his time and effort.

People were arriving – and Walter was so busy working with the sound system, that I had to remind him to change into his tux. Once changed, he looked official – tails and all. He laughingly told the audience that "looking the part" is often half the battle.

After introducing our club officers, board and volunteers, I took the opportunity to promote the ski club and directed the crowd to applications and trip schedules. About two-thirds of the group were SCSCers, with family, church members, Scottish Societies, piano and HLS&R friends comprising the remainder.

Shannon Lillis, Associate Director of the Sunshine Kids, was our guest for the evening. She took a few minutes to educate us on the organization, and expressed the organization's

appreciation for our contributions over the years.

Walter's Mother insisted that he start working towards concertizing at the age of four. Although his ambitions were later directed toward the field of chemistry, playing the piano has always been a passion for Walter. I have to believe his Mother enjoyed every moment of that Tuesday evening as she sat on her heavenly perch watching over her son's performance. Mothers always deserve a lot of unsolicited praise!

For an encore, Walter finished with Rachmaninoff's Prelude Op. 3, No. 2, C# minor. At the conclusion of the program, Walter and I decided to express our love for our country during this critical time. I joined Walter on my flute, and together we played "God Bless America". To our delight, the crowd began to sing along.

Everyone seemed to enjoy their glass of wine, hors d'oeuvres, and the music. Walter and I are very grateful to those who supported us in this endeavor – and we feel very appreciative that our efforts will help brighten the lives of some children struggling with cancer.




