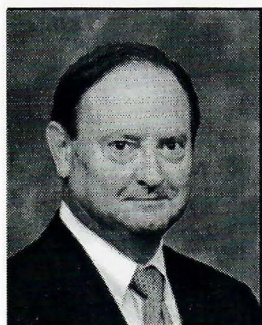


BACKSTAGE CREW
