and scheduled activities.



Get ready for a long weekend in the sun as SCSC joins other ski clubs from Texas at the Port Royal resort in Port Aransas, Texas. In 2008, 27 of us had a very enjoyable vacation. Port Royal is a luxury resort 10 miles south of the vacation town of Port Aransas. It is located on the east side of State Highway 361 between the highway and Gulf of Mexico. There is a great beach located behind the resort. As great as the beach is, most of our people spent most of their time around the giant swimming pool complex. Activities will include swimming, sunbathing, water volleyball, water slides and two poolside bars. In addition, Port Royal features an inside bar, fine dining restaurant, conference room and gift shop. Shopping is available in Port Aransas, nearby Corpus Christi and other small towns.

The activity schedule has not been finalized, but should be something like this: Friday night will likely be a group dinner in Port Aransas. During the daylight hours on Saturday, most

of the activities will be centered around the pool (or in it). The beach is great for an early morning walk or run. Saturday night will be club dinners and possibly a late night beach bonfire. Sunday will probably be on your own.

We will be staying in LARGE, luxury 2x2 condos with full kitchens and balconies. There is covered parking under the condos. Everyone will be driving to Port Royal on their own. In 2008, we experimented with different routes and the shortest appears to be about 3.5 hours after you clear metropolitan Houston. You will need one vacation day at the most. Last year, several people used a half day or left directly from work on Friday afternoon.

The final budget has not been approved. This trip was passed by our Excom at a price not to exceed \$160 per person, which will include two nights at the luxury condos, the club dinner and all activities. A shuttle may be available at the resort; however, you should plan on arranging your own transportation. We are trying to budget the trip at a target price of \$140 per person, depending on the final room rate quotation.

Leaving Houston on Continental Tuesday 24th November at the civilized hour of 9.00am and returning Sunday 29th in the evening we are away for 6 days and 5 nights.

Winter Park is located an easy coach ride from Denver airport. With a stop for groceries and adult beverages we should be at the resort in plenty of time to get situated and organize rental gear so that we are ready for Wednesday morning. No need to lug heavy gear the rental shop is in the condo complex.

We are staying in the ONLY ski-in-ski-out accommodation in Winter Park. Each Zephyr Mountain Lodge luxury condominium is equipped with full kitchen, fireplace and free high speed internet. There are 4 outdoor hot tubs, a state of the art fitness room and Starbucks in the complex!

Winter Park resort is 9000ft above sea level rising to over 12,000ft. With snowmaking on 26 trails, Winter Park guarantees opening before Thanksgiving. Check out the snow chart

on the website – some years they have had 40 inches of snow in October!

There are great deals on lift passes, equipment rental and ski lessons. Not to mention fun après events including a Thanksgiving dinner and a trip



into Winter Park village. Winter Park's free shuttle bus service makes it easy to explore the local restaurants, cafés and galleries.

For the kids there is the option of all day ski school with the Youth Program (all day lesson, lunch and rentals) and a night out without your parents! Last year the kids were the best behaved on the trip (by far!).

Other than skiing and snowboarding there is ice skating, evening snowbike excursions, scenic chairlift to The Lodge at Sunspot, snowshoe tours, snowcat tours, hot springs and free guided mountain orientation tours.

Aosta, Italy is the destination for the Texas Ski Council's 2010 Winter Expedition. Aosta is often referred to as the Rome of the Alps. It ranks third among Italian cities for its number of ancient Roman ruins. SCSC will be departing Houston on Thursday, January 21 and returning Friday, January 29, 2010. We will be staying at Hostellerie du Cheval Blanc. This hotel is

located near Aosta's historical centre and 800 meters from the cableway to Pila ski area.

The town of Aosta is located in the center of the valley of Aosta. Aosta Valley lies in the most mountainous region of Italy and is located in the northwest corner adjoining Switzerland and France. The valley is sur-

rounded by the splendid peaks of the Alps: Mont Blanc, Monte Rosa, the Matterhorn, and the Gran Paradiso. This valley comprises twenty ski resorts. Among these are five world-class ski areas, all accessed by a single lift pass: Aosta-Pila (our base), Cour-

We leave Houston at 8:50 am on Continental and arrive in Portland, Oregon at 11 am for a wonderful 7 days of fun. A scenic








