Why should everyone sign up for a ski trip this month? In many ways, skiing is better than sex. Here are some reasons why.







Lillehammer- a difficult pronunciation and rumored to be the most difficult word you will have to pronounce in Norway. Be with fellow SCSCers as we begin our trek to Lillehammer, home to the 1994 Winter Olympics. We will depart on NW/ KLM on January 24th, 2003, spending our first two nights in Oslo at the four-star Scandi Hotel. Following an orientation tour of Oslo, we are free to explore the city and partake of the night-life.

Crested Butte, CO





Membership Lessons

This column is intended to help you get the most from being a member of SCSC. You will find here an article about SCSC and your relationship to it. The information is often derived from SCSC's Bylaws and Standing Rules. Sometimes seriously, sometimes humorously – we try to simplify and put them in perspective for you.

This Month:

Mail-in Sign-Up, Land Packages, & Wait-Lists

Mail-In Sign-Up (Standing Rule 8.1): Until this year, the process of Mail-In Sign-Up required approval by the Executive Committee, or ExComm, (the club officers) each year it was offered. Last October, the Board of Directors (the ExComm plus 10 past officers) approved changes to the club's Standing Rules which made this an official form of enrollment for ski trips.

It was originally started about 15 years ago as a way to more fairly offer sign-up opportunities to the membership. Prior to that, members had to attend the September General Meeting to sign up "early" on a particular trip. If a trip was popular, as today, it would often "sell out" at that meeting. If you could not get to the meeting early enough to get a good place in the line, or if you could not attend the meeting, you would find your first, and maybe second, choice trip already full and with a long wait list (more about those later). By offering ski-trip sign-up through the mail, and for a specified period, SCSC "levelled the playing field" for all members, giving everyone the *opportunity* to get their registration in before a trip filled. A side benefit was a reduction of the enormously long lines that formed at each September General Meeting.

Be sure to read ALL of the details of "The Art of Mail-In Sign-Up" on the back of the trip registration form in this issue. Paying attention to those details will help ensure you get the trip you want this ski season.

Land Packages (Standing Rule 8.7): A Land Package is a lower priced trip package that does not include air transportation to the ski destination. This gives those who have lots of frequent-flyer miles, travel points, or other low-cost travel options the opportunity to save money on a trip, and possibly afford more trips! Land packages also work for out-of-town members who don't want or need to come through Houston to reach the destination.

Actually, if you read SR 8.7, you won't find any mention of Land Packages. They fall under the

"unless otherwise authorized by the Executive Committee" portion of the rule. On each trip budget, the Vice President of Trips works with the TC and ATC to determine if land packages are feasible for the trip. For example, if the trip is sold to the club as a complete package, with air, by a tour operator (as some TSC trips are); or if offering land packages would significantly decrease the comps, or group discounts, we receive and thereby make the full package price too high, then land packages will not be offered. If land packages are offered on a trip, then the land package is approved by the ExComm along with the trip budget.

Like Mail-In Sign-Up, land packages have not been around for an extremely long time. We first offered these on a couple of trips in the 1994-1995 season. They proved to be, and still are, very popular and we have continued to offer them on each trip we can each season.

One thing is optional on land packages – ground transportation. Before signing up, you need to find out from the TC or ATC if a land package includes transportation from the airport to the ski resort. Usually it is – often, SCSC must arrange group transportation, such as a charter bus, and must pay for the full bus even if not all seats are filled. In this case, the land package will contain the bus cost, even if it is not used by the participant. Many land package participants arrange to arrive on the same flight as the group, or arrive earlier, and want to be transported to the resort with the group. On the other hand, transportation to the resort sometimes is strictly on a per person cost basis, as with some shuttles, and the ground transportation will be left out of the land package to allow the participant to choose how they are transported to the resort, and at their own cost. For these reasons, ALWAYS check with the TC to see if ground transportation is included in a land package.

Wait Lists (Standing Rule 7.6): When a trip has signed up as many participants as they have budgeted for the trip, they begin placing those who wish to participant on the trip on a wait list. A wait list is used to allow members to "get in line" for vacancies which occur on the participant list after the initial sign-up. Every ski trip has several cancellations between sign-up and time for the trip to depart. Those who tender their trip deposit and sign-up for the wait list, will be offered, in the order they were added to the wait list, vacancies on the trip as they occur. The deposit is held by the TC until the member agrees to fill a vacant slot on the trip. When a vacancy occurs, the TC will begin calling, in order, those on the Wait List and offering them the open slot. If the member accepts, the member's check is deposited and the member is added to the wait list. If the member does not accept the slot, he/she is dropped from the wait list and the TC calls the next person in line on the list.

On trips which have Land Packages, separate Wait Lists are maintained for the full-package and land package registrations. The two wait lists are worked independently, as openings occur for each type of trip package.

Some people feel that getting on a Wait List is a waste of time. Many members, however, can attest to having gotten the trip of their choice by first being on the Wait List for that trip. NEVER hesitate to get on the wait list for a trip you really want. As stated previously, cancellations ALWAYS occur, and if a wait list is long, the club can sometimes negotiate additional space on the trip to allow as many members to participate as possible. After all, that is our goal!

If you have any questions about the items discussed in this column, or other issues relating to your membership, don't hesitate to call any officer of the club and discuss it with them. Our goal is to offer our members the best club experience possible.
