Happy 1999! We are at the peak of the ski season. From now until the end of March we will have skiers out almost every week. The 1998 ski trips are mere memories, but I'm sure all went well. (Actually as most of you know I write my article a month ahead so the only trip I really know about is Copper). The Copper trip was a huge success, except for the lack of snow. We came in second in the races with eight medals. Cheryl May won her division for the individuals. We're off to a great start for the cup this year. Our two December trips, Red River and Whistler were full and I'm sure we'll be reading spectacular reviews of these in the months to come.

Due to some unusual circumstances, we still have several openings on the Sun Valley trip leaving January 23. Sun Valley is a great resort, and we've got a great group of people going, so if you can free up your schedule for the week of January 23 be sure to give Christie a call before it's too late. Another anomaly in this year's sign ups is the Crested Butte trip. There are 10 spots left. This is an incredible opportunity that I'm sure will not last long. Also, both Heavenly long trips are full with long wait lists, but

the Heavenly short trip still has 9 openings. This is a great opportunity to participate the TSC Final Showdown and be part of an SCSC record group of over 150 skiers and/or gamblers.

If you still want to be considered for some of the other trips be sure to get your name on the wait list. Remember, all this involves is writing a \$100 check that will not be cashed until your are notified and accept a spot on the trip. It secures your place in the order of those called if openings do occur. The trips with relatively short wait lists include France, Breckenridge, and Jackson Hole. Or if you can sign up last minute, don't forget the emergency wait list. For five dollars your name and number will be placed on a list used by TC's in the last week before a trip when unexpected vacancies occur. You will discuss trip price directly with the trip participant canceling.

As we're getting to the point were your final payments are due, I want to spend a few minutes reviewing our cancellation procedures. If you cancel off a trip, you must notify the club preferably through the TC of the trip *in writing*. Your TC will have a cancellation form you can use to do this. You are not off the trip and we cannot find a replacement until we have your written cancellation. After final payment you will be responsible for the trip payment if a replacement is not found. SCSC Standing Rule 5.0 in your phone directory explains these policies. Several of you have made \$100 deposits and have not followed through with final payments or cancellation letters. Since you missed final payment we have replaced you on the trip, however we cannot refund any money without your written cancellation form.

In closing I just want to reiterate that we are having a spectacular ski season with over 700 skiers. I need to thank again this years great ski planning team of DOT's, TC's, ATC's, Ex-com, Board, and race director. From now on keep thinking SNOW and we'll see you on the mountain.

SLICK WILLY SKIS

by Thanksgiving Skiers

Certain high molecular weight polymers with strong hydrophilic character are known for their water retention capability and generally "slippery" feel. When these polymers are applied to moving parts, lubrication results in less friction and more trouble free use. Exploration of these characteristics has resulted in a new application of these polymers to skis. The authors are pleased to report that application of these polymers to skis will speed progress through all types of snow with much faster runs and better control.

These types of polymers are well known and in common use. Members of SCSC (Senior Citizens Sex Club) are well aware of a product available at your local drug store known as "KY Jelly" that utilizes these types of compounds. The authors of this report have done extensive research on these types of products in various applications and discovered its use on the ski slope.

Application of the product to the bottom and on each ski just before a racing run is sure to improve your time on the race

course. Even if you DQ, use of the product enables the applicant to reach the finish line in record time on a rear end slide.


The group travelling to Copper Mountain over Thanksgiving set a new club record and used 78 four-ounce tubes of the product in a five day period. Other clubs in the Texas Ski Council were absolutely amazed at the results of this group on the slopes.

It should be pointed out that skis and snowboards require frequent application. The material dissolves in water and is removed by friction on snow. This is different from more familiar uses in which the operating system is closed and only one application is generally required. Excessive use of the compound should be avoided. There was a report of one couple sliding from a bed because of over application.

The authors of this report prefer to remain anonymous although they are happy to share some of their research on uses of these types of polymeric compounds.


