

SCSC Golf Tornament





The Art of Mail in Sign-Up and The Fine Print

Mail-in Sign-Up: HERE IT IS! Your chance to get an early berth on your favorite SCSC ski trip(s) for 1999-2000. The mail-in sign-up form is in this issue of the Sitzmarke, so copy it or clip it out and follow the instructions below. Then, wait for the trip TC to notify you if you are on the trip or come to the September meeting at the Holiday Inn Select to verify your registration and pick up additional information the TC will have for you.

- 1. Mail-in sign-up begins on Monday, August 23 and ends on Friday, Sept 2. Your sign-up envelopes must be postmarked on or between these dates. (Registration received with postmarks outside these dates will be held until the September General Meeting. If you visit the trip table you may be added to the trip <u>at that time</u>, (space permitting.)
- 2. You must be a **current member in good standing.** In general this means you should have renewed your membership prior to August 1, 1999. Your 1999-2000 membership number should be shown on the mailing label for the August Sitzmarke. Call your VP of Membership, John Rice, if you have questions.
- 3. You may sign-up yourself and one other SCSC member per trip (see by-law 2.8.A. in your club directory).
- 4. In the registration envelope include the trip registration form and your deposit. The deposit for the Soll, Austria & the Bariloche, Argentina trips are \$300.00 per participant. The deposit on all other trips is \$100 per participant. Checks should be made payable to "SCSC" and should have your membership number and the trip name listed on the check.
- 5. Mail your registration to the Trip Coordinator for the trip on which you wish to participate. TC's names and addresses for all trips are listed in this Sitzmarke. If your registration is mailed to anyone other than the TC, it will be returned to you and you will not be registered for the trip.
- 6. If the postmark is correct and the registration meets the above guidelines, **names will be added to each trip's Participant List** in the order received. If a trip's participant roster fills during mail-in sign-up, additional registrations received will be added to a Wait List in the order received. The TC will hold checks for wait-listed members until a space becomes available on the trip. Participants that are on trips, your checks will be deposited on or after August 31st.
- 7. These procedures apply to ALL members (except the trip's TC and ATC) and all Trip Participants are subject to SCSC Standing Rules, Policies and Procedures.
- 8. SCSC is not responsible for any problems with the U.S. Postal Service, including delayed delivery or lost mail.
- 9. Information shown on the Trip Schedule is subject to change. Contact the TC or ATC for up-to-date info.
- 10. Any registrations received, which do not meet the above qualifications, may be returned to the sender.

Land Packages: The Executive Committee has approved Land Packages on some of this year's trips. On the trips which there are limited number of land packages available, if all are filled, you will be given the option of being on a "Land Wait List" or switching to a full package.

Because of the restrictions noted below for land packages, be sure you have concrete travel arrangements made before you sign up for one of these. SCSC will not be responsible for any difficulties or extra expense you incur due to delayed or canceled flights or other transportation problems.

Rules and restrictions for Land Packages

- 1. The price of the land package will be the full trip price minus participant's airfare. Ground transportation will be included and will be available to land package participants <u>if</u> they can meet the group at the destination airport on time. Ground transportation will <u>not</u> be delayed for land package participants arriving later than the group.
- 2. Other than the full package, this is the only package price available; no other combinations of lodging and/or transportation will be offered. (Note: As in the past, members may still arrange their own transportation, lodging, etc., and pay only for the parties and trip options. If so, please arrange to do this in advance, ideally by the pre-trip party.)
- 3. Normal cancellation and transfer policies apply with the added stipulation that, on or after final payment date, land package participants must be replaced from a land package wait list and full package participants must be replaced from a full package wait list in order to transfer or receive a refund.
- 4. It may not be possible to convert your trip from land package to full package, or vice versa. The Club may not be able to secure additional airline seats.
- 5. If you sign up for land package, please notify the TC of your transportation plans in advance of the trip. The TC can tell you where to meet the group or other pertinent information.

SNOWMASS II TSC TRADITIONAL January 9 - 16, 2000 (Sunday - Sunday) \$877

This self-contained resort is larger than the combined acreage of the other three areas (Aspen Highlands, Aspen Mtn., and Buttermilk) that comprise the Aspen scene. Snowmass is large enough to be ranked among the five largest resorts in America, yet it's difficult to be considered an entity separate from Aspen. Most people who visit Snowmass spend at least some time in the town of Aspen. But make no mistake: One could visit Snowmass for a week and still not experience the entire mass of its five mountain sections. All levels of skiers will be challenged here. With 55% of it's terrain intermediate, it features enough curl-your-toes steeps to keep hard core extremists happy. Base elevation: 8,222 feet; Summit elevation: 12,510 feet; Vertical drop: 406 feet; Skiable terrain: 3,010 acres; Number of trails: 83; Longest run: 4-1/8 miles; Lifts and capacity: 20 (15 chairs, 5 surface); Average annual snowfall: 300 inches; Snowmaking: Yes; Terrain mix: Green 7% - Blue 55% - Black 18% - Double Black 20%; Snowboarding: Yes - park halfpipes; Cross-country skiing: 50 miles of trails. New skiers will enjoy Buttermilk Mountain. For those who need more knee pounding excitement there is always Aspen Mountain (Ajax) or Aspen Highlands. All mountains and ski areas are accessible using the local shuttle service. At the base of this massive mountain is the Snowmass Village and shopping mall-the pedestrian epi-center of the resort - with a selection of shops, restaurants and bars. One of the most appealing features of the trip will be the proximity of the Wildwood Inn Condos to the Fanny Hill lift, about 50 yards - this is considered ski-in/ski-out. Everything is within easy walking distance in Snowmass Village and a shuttle between Snowmass and Aspen runs every 15 minutes. The party set will be delighted with Aspen's variety. Everything from Rock 'n' Roll to Country. You will not be disappointed. This is a TSC event and it's going to be fun, fun, fun, so don't be left out. Dig out your long johns and get ready to party.

SNOWMASS III TSC TRADITIONAL January 11-16, 2000 (Tuesday - Sunday) \$741

Y-2, says who? Begin the millennium with the ski experience of the century! This trip's for those serious skiers and partiers that want to maximize their skiing, party hard and minimize hassle. Try this:

> 4 full days of skiing! Only 3 vacation days! Fly into Aspen airport! Texas Ski Council Activities! FUN!!

We'll stay at the Wildwood Lodge with all the other Space City skiers! The Wildwood is a prime ski-in/ski-out location, and steps from the conference center where all the TSC parties get started. So where to ski? You can choose a different area each day. Snowmass, our ski-in/ski-out headquarters for the trip, is known for its long, cruising trails. Don't let anybody tell you size doesn't matter - its 4400 vertical feet offer ski trails for everyone: 7% beginner, 55% intermediate and 38% advanced. You'll find challenge, steeps and bumps at Aspen, only 8 miles down the road. Aspen has no beginner slopes, but offers a mix of 35% intermediate and 65% advanced and expert ski trails. Aspen Highlands is a favorite with locals and offers half groomed/ half natural trails - With 3600 vertical feet, its trail mix is 20% beginner, 33% intermediate, and 47% advanced/expert. Finally, there is Buttermilk/Tiehack with a reputation as a great learning mountain for beginners and for its long-lasting powder in the advanced areas. At Buttermilk, 35% of the trails are beginner, 39% intermediate, and 26% are advanced. AND with the new ski equipment transfer service between all the ski mountains, there's no reason to lug skis back on the bus. They'll be waiting for you wherever you choose the next morning! There will be races, picnics, happy hours and parties! You'll want to find time to visit Aspen for spectacular shopping, sample its world class night life and rub elbows with the rich and famous! 


