Dateline - Telluride, February 1st through February 8th, 1997 **Bill Bomberger** Reporting. All sources for this information is confidential, but the reporter will accept bribes for those desperate enough for the information. Boy is it nice to have to be at the airport at a reasonable hour to start a fabulous ski trip. Everybody made it to the airport with time to spare, including **Carrie Niemeyer** who flew in from Dallas to meet us for the trip. After arriving at the Montrose Airport, we then loaded all of the participants into 3 15 passenger vans for the trip into Telluride. The van drivers that picked up all of the skiers were warned in advance that the Ski Club always travels with the minimum amount of luggage required for the trip. They were really surprised when all of our luggage would not fit on top of the 3 vans that they had arranged for us to use. The food and some of the drinks for the trip had to hitch hike on another van for the hour long trip to Telluride. The van drivers earned every penny of their tips for the luggage handling and I thank all of the participants for their help Also. After arriving in Telluride, everybody started their exercise routine in carrying their luggage up stairs (no first floor accommodations and no elevators available).

Our opening wine and cheese party was held in **Joanne Fore's** condominium, with representatives of the ski area graciously joining us for drinks and snacks. After all of the free information that they gave us about the area and services available, about half of the participants decided to take lessons. Their prices were the most reasonably priced that this Reporter has seen in a long time.



Most of the skiers, including **Janet Arentzen, Mary Pat Rapp, Darcy Farley**, your reporter, **Patty Maudsley**, and others (too many to be remembered) opted for the mini ski week that included 3 days of morning lessons in small groups with afternoons off to recover or practice newly found skills for the next day.

On the trip there were several memorable groups that skied and or partied together everyday. The biggest group consisted of **Tom Mercer, Debbie Starnes, David Lindsay, Pam Holder, Ray Naudain, and Diane Jamail**. They most frequently could be found cruising on the black slopes with some serious Blue cruising also occurring. Another group that took an advanced lesson included **Bob2** (Bob Squared = **Bob**



Davis and Bob Porter) and **Terri Hesse**. This reporter skied with the above groups and will not report anything unfavorable due to pay backs from the skiers involved. On the trip, **Patti Maudslay** won the Special Award for Ski Patrol Tester by having a ride down the mountain because her boots did not fit properly and her feet hurt. I have no report on whether the single Ski Patroller had any influence on Patti or not. (No other injuries were reported to this reporter.) Another Special Award was presented to **Bob Porter** for his skiing problems on one apparent day. He kept crashing on the mountain for no apparent reasons other than being bitten by the proverbial Snow

Snake. (According to his ski partners, 6" of fresh powder was no excuse.) Some of our intermediate skiers, **Janet Arentzen, Joanne Fore, Patti Maudslay**, and others that participated in lessons were invited by their instructor to visit the top of the



mountain for some spectacular views off of one of the tougher blue runs, **See Forever**, on her own time. It took some time, but they all successfully made it down the mountain. The views from Telluride are spectacular, but from this particular run and on a clear day, you can see the mountains in Utah.

Some of the night time activities included a group at a German Tavern doing some serious beer drinking out of the Glass Boot. 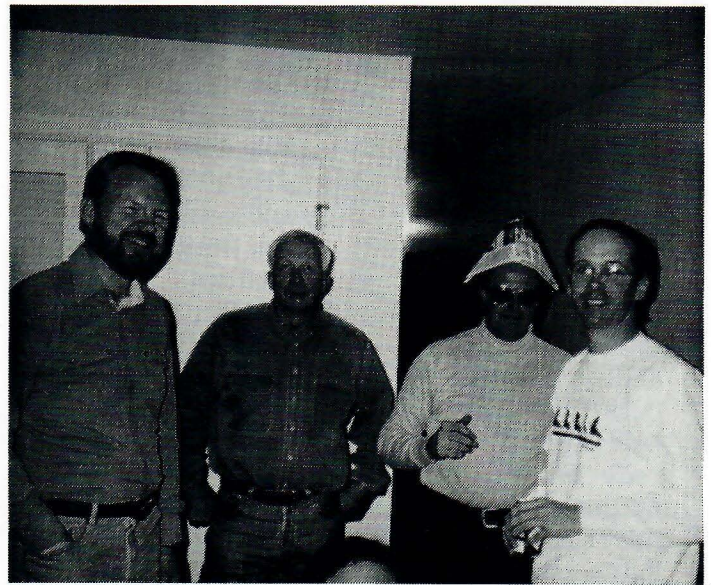
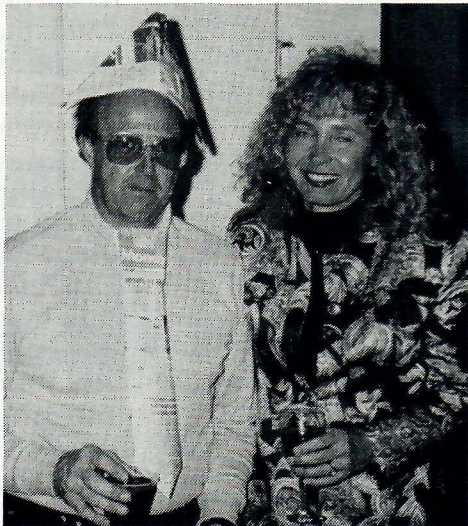
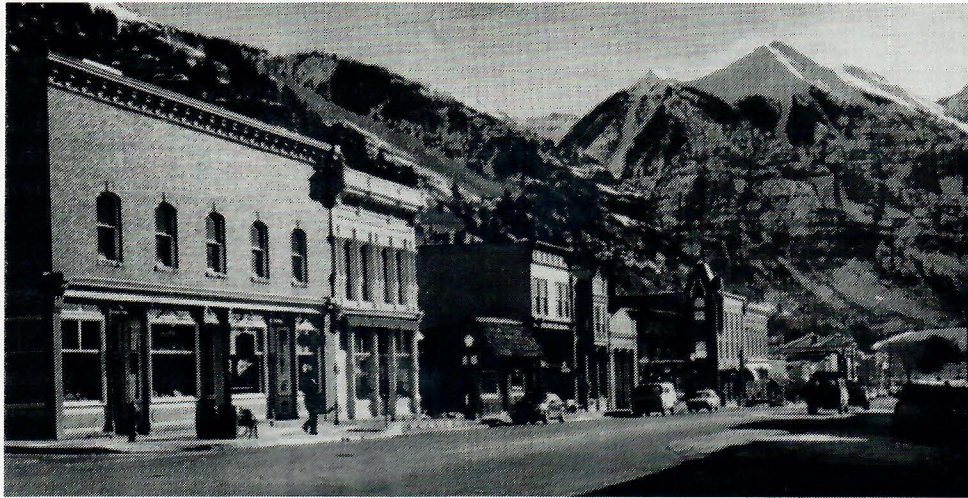

APPLICABLE STANDING RULES OF SPACE CITY SKI CLUB, INC.

- 1.0 DUES. Dues shall be \$25 per single person and \$35 per married couple. Members who renew their current membership prior to June 1, will receive a \$5 discount per membership. Dues are non-refundable, may not be pro-rated, and may not be converted to couple status during the membership year.
- 5.0 TRIP PENALTIES.
- 5.1 A. If a trip participant withdraws from a trip after the published final payment date, the trip participant will lose the entire payment upon withdrawal. If the participant can be replaced from the waiting list, the participant will be refunded the entire payment less any costs incurred by the Club in addition to cancellation fees as specified in 5.2. If the trip participant cannot be replaced from the waiting list, the participant will be refunded the amount which the Trip Coordinator is able to recover by cancellation of lodging, transportation, and/or other commitments less any costs incurred by the Club and cancellation fees as specified in 5.2.
- B. If a trip participant fails to make final payment by the published final payment date, the trip coordinator may replace the participant after making a diligent effort to contact the participant, who will be subject to cancellation fees as specified in 5.2. (Effective 1/5/92)
- 5.2 CANCELLATION FEES.
- A participant may forfeit his full deposit if he fails to notify the Club in writing of his intent to withdraw prior to the published final payment dates. A minimum charge of \$30 will be assessed for each trip cancellation. (Effective 6/92)
- 5.3 A charge of \$10.00 will be assessed for each trip transfer. A transfer will not be considered after final payment date unless a replacement can be secured. (Effective 9/21/92)
- 5.4 Deposit, transfer and cancellation charges for non-domestic trips shall be determined by the Executive Committee and included in the trip release form as well as in all trip publicity; in no case shall these requirements be less than those provided in Sections 5.2 and 5.3 of these Standing Rules.
- 5.5 NO SNOW.
- If the Club encounters a cancellation situation prior to the departure of a trip, the trip participant is entitled to recover the entire cost of the trip less charges incurred by the Club as a penalty for cancellation of lodging, transportation, operating expenses and/or other commitments made on behalf of a trip participant. Refunds to any trip will be made upon receipt by the Club of the total refund due the Club by the resort, airline and/or other entity or as approved by the Executive Committee.
- 7.0 RESTRICTIONS.
- 7.1 Allowing non-trip participants to occupy any room as a non-registered guest is strictly prohibited, and in violation of Club policy.
- 7.2 The illegal use of controlled substances and/or alcohol during Club trips, or any other official Club function, is in violation of Club policy, and is strictly prohibited.
- 7.3 No substitutions of trip participants shall be allowed without the knowledge and approval of the Trip Coordinator, and new additions to the trip shall come from that trip's Waiting List. The Trip Coordinator shall make all substitutions.
- 7.4 It is the policy of the Club not to allow the active solicitation of the general membership at a Club function or in the Club publication for any other than Club sponsored trips or activities without the consent of the Executive Committee.
- 7.5 No person may participate in a Club sponsored trip, or participant paid activity, without first completing a written and signed Release of Liability for that trip or activity, on a form approved by the Board of Directors.
- 7.6 No person may sign a waiver for a sponsored trip without being embedded. A trip cannot be started before a list can be started. A deposit is required in order to sign up on a trip wait list.
- 7.7 A Club officer, Director or Director(s) of Trips shall not accept a gratuity in excess of \$25 from a vendor without giving notice to the Executive Committee.
- 8.0 MISCELLANEOUS.
- 8.1 SKI TRIP SIGN UP
- A. No member shall be allowed to sign up for any ski trip prior to the September General Meeting except as designated by prior approval of the Executive Committee.
- B. Each member may sign up for him/herself and one other member on any ski trip or ski trip waiting list.
- 8.2 WEATHER. If a trip should be "weathered-in" the additional lodging expense will be left up to the individual, although the Trip Coordinator will assist in making accommodation arrangements, and collection for same shall be left up to the lodge.
- 8.3 NON-SKI TRIPS/ACTIVITIES. Reservations for participation in such activities may require full payment, instead of a deposit fee.

APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY
