

Hopefully, as you find out more details about each trip, you will too!! If I could find a way, I'd go on <u>ALLOF THEM!!</u> But, perhaps this is the year to take that extra trip. The TCs, ATCs, and DOTs have worked very hard to keep prices down without sacrificing the quality our members have come to expect. But, now is the time to begin deciding our destination(s) for the next ski season. To help you with your decision(s), let me share a few comments about each trip.

Breckenridge or TSC "Fall Round-Up" always sells out. Somehow there always seems to be adequate snow in Summit County every Thanksgiving and, the interchangeable ticket gives you plenty of options to ski the "best" snow in the area - - Breckenridge, Keystone, Beaver Creek, or even Vail.. The Red

River/Taos trip is designed to appeal to newly recruited skiers or members who wish to "tune-up" for the season. Red River is offering 2 and 1/2 days of lessons and members can opt to "test their skills" during a ski day at Taos or opt for a snowmobile outing. Dreaming about a "White Christmas". Our "Family Optional" trip to Purgatory is sure to be the X-Mas gift of the season!! The hidden secret of this destination is the lift ticket that can be exchanged for other options!!

TSC "Traditional" continues this season at Steamboat Springs, always a favorite destination for our club. This year both the Long & Short trips will fly direct into Hayden and both trips are staying at the same lodging. Aspen is the "Classic" club favorite. We are again staying Aspen (this year we are flying direct to Aspen Airport) and, with the universal lift ticket, we have the opportunity to ski four mountains just minutes away. Return to Big Mountain is the long awaited return to a resort not visited by SCSC in several years. This year's trip promises to create "new" memories! Sierra Nevada, Spain or TSC "Winter Expedition" offers the opportunity to discover a new European destination. Imagine standing at the top of the Veleta and being able to see clear across the Mediterranean to Africa!


Spend President's Day at Telluride or TSC "Winter Shoot-out". Our Long & Short trips will fly direct into Montrose and this destination offers something for every level of skier and boarder. Winter Park, another destination not visited by SCSC in recent years. This trip may be the surprise for "REAL TEXANS". Although our Ski Utah trip is staying at Park City, members will also have the chance to ski nearby Deer Valley, Snowbird, Alta or Brighton and see the future venues of the 2000 Winter Olympics..

Our Lake Tahoe trip is sure to be "Heavenly." Spring skiing at its finest and the opprotunity to hit the casinos too!!! And, don't forget, this is spring break for HISD - not every school in the nation. The TSC "Final Showdown" at Lake Louise has all TSC clubs staying at the picturesque Chateau Lake Louise, which is set in the Banff National Park 2 1/2 hours from Calgary. This trip also offers the opportunity to ski the neighboring ski resorts of Sunshine Village and Mt. Norquay - all on the same lift ticket.





THE ART OF MAIL-IN SIGN-UP AND THE FINE PRINT

Mail-in Sign-Up: HERE IT IS! Your chance to get an early berth on your favorite SCSC ski trip(s) for 1997-1998. The mail-in sign-up form is in this issue of the Sitzmarke, so copy it or clip it out and follow the instructions below. Then, wait for the trip TC to notify you if you are on the trip or come to the September meeting at the Holiday Inn Select to verify your registration and pick up additional information the TC will have for you.

1. Mail-in sign-up begins on **Monday**, **August 18** and ends on **Friday**, **August 30**. Your sign-up envelopes **must be postmarked on or between these dates**. (Registration received with postmarks outside these dates will be held until the September General Meeting. If you visit the trip table you may be added to the trip <u>at that time</u>, space permitting.)

2. You must be a **current member in good standing.** In general this means you should have renewed your membership prior to August 1, 1997. Your 1997-98 membership number should be shown on the mailing label for the August Sitzmarke. Call your VP of Membership Dave Stotz, if you have questions.

3. You may sign-up yourself and one other SCSC member per trip (see By-Law 2.8.A. in your club directory).

4. In the registration envelope include the trip registration form and your deposit. The deposit for the Sierra Nevada, Spain & the Queenstown, New Zealand trips are \$300.00 per participant. The deposit on all other trips is \$100 per participant. Checks should be made payable to "SCSC" and should have your membership number and the trip name listed on the check.

- 5. **Mail your registration to the Trip Coordinator** for the trip on which you wish to participate. TC's names and addresses for all trips are listed in this Sitzmarke. If your registration is mailed to anyone other than the TC, it will be returned to you and you will not be registered for the trip.
- 6. If the postmark is correct and the registration meets the above guidelines, names will be added to each trip's Participant List in the order received. If a trip's participant roster fills during mail-in sign-up, additional registrations received will be added to a Wait List in the order received. Checks for wait-listed members will be held by the TC until a space becomes available on the trip. Participants that are on trips, your checks will be deposited on or after August 31st.

These procedures apply to ALL members (except the trip's TC and ATC) and all Trip Participants are subject to SCSC Standing Rules, Policies and Procedures.

- 8. SCSC is not responsible for any problems with the U.S. Postal Service, including delayed delivery or lost mail.
- 9. Information shown on the Trip Schedule is subject to change. Contact the TC or ATC for up-to-date info.
- 10. Any registration received which does not meet the above qualifications may be returned to the sender.

Land Packages: The Executive Committee has approved Land Packages on some of this year's trips. On the trips which there are limited number of land packages available, if all are filled, you will be given the option of being on a "Land Wait List" or switching to a full package.

Because of the restrictions noted below for land packages, **be sure** you have concrete travel arrangements made before you sign up for one of these. SCSC will not be responsible for any difficulties or extra expense you incur due to delayed or canceled flights or other transportation problems.

Rules and restrictions for Land Packages

- The price of the land package will be the full trip price minus participant's airfare, with the exception of New Zealand. Ground transportation will be included and will be available to land package participants if they can meet the group at the destination airport on time. Ground transportation will not be delayed for land package participants arriving later than the group. Special Note for New Zealand: Land Package offered on New Zealand is for roundtrip from Los Angeles, CA (LAX Airport)/New Zealand.
- 2. Other than the full package, this is the only package price available; no other combinations of lodging and/or transportation will be offered. (note: As in the past, members may still arrange their own transportation, lodging, etc., and pay only for the parties and trip options. If so, please arrange to do this in advance, ideally by the pre-trip party.)
- 3. Normal cancellation and transfer policies apply -- with the added stipulation that, on or after final payment date, land package participants must be replaced from a land package wait list and full package participants must be replaced from a full package wait list in order to transfer or receive a refund.






