





For the latest status on any trip, please contact the TC or ATC.

If you still can't decide where you want to go, the perfect option is to sign up on wait lists. You receive the option of joining the trip as an opening becomes available, and there won't be a penalty if you decline. While some lists may seem to be too long, invariably as the departure date draws closer, some folks have to unfortunately cancel off due to circumstances they had no way of predicting. Trips with short or no wait lists are Purgatory, Steamboat I & II, Aspen, Spain, and Lake Tahoe. Remember, the Wait List insures that you get a chance at an opening!!! If you don't get on the wait list, the TC won't know you are interested.

Afraid that the Wait List won't be of any help??? Just ask the few lucky members that are going to Steamboat with the Clear Lake Ski Club. The Clear Lake Ski Club had space available for the TSC Traditional and approached our club about utilizing their space. Their club is staying at the same lodging property as SCSC and the trip is only slightly more expensive than our club's cost. But the GREAT NEWS is that 7 members of SCSC that were on the Wait List are going to Steamboat. This is really a win-win for both clubs. Back this year is the emergency wait list. This wait list will be in addition to the normal wait list for each trip. Those who can leave at a last minute's notice will discover this may be a great cost savings for you! See VP Trips or DOTs for details or sign up.....price is only \$5.00.

One very **important note**. As was the case last year, our ticketing needs to be very exact concerning names. Each participant over 18 must provide **PHOTO ID** when checking baggage and when boarding. **This ID must match the name on the ticket**. Our trip leaders will do their best to acquire your exact name. Please assist them by checking the spelling they have for you at the pretrip parties, and on any trip correspondence. Late cancellations will be affected as we may incur a penalty making last minute name changes.

A few words about final payments and cancellations. It is the member's responsibility to get payments to the TC by the final payment date. If you fail to do so, you may be replaced. Please inform the Trip Coordinator as soon as possible of any problems you may encounter. If you intend to cancel, you must notify the club, *in writing*, on or before the final payment date of your intention. Failure to do so may incur the loss of all moneys. While we have had good luck in the past at securing replacements for canceled participants, it's always a gamble. The more time you give the trip leaders to replace you, the better your chance at securing a refund. Don't forget a cancellation fee will be deducted from any refund.

The holidays give us an opportunity to review the months that have passed and reflect on the many blessings we have. This club is very blessed with fantastic volunteers!! Recently Steven Teoh stepped up to the challenge and volunteered to be ATC for our Spain trip. Unfortunately a short time later, Steven had to back down; however, Lee Swords quickly stepped up to take over the reins as ATC. Many thanks to Steven & Lee. Next time you see any of the DOTs, TCs, or ATCs, please give them a special thank you for all of their efforts. It's the dedication of our volunteers that makes this club great!







Sunday, October the 19th was the perfect day for 51 skater - skiers. The sky was clear and temperature in the 80's. Thanks to on-site early arrival volunteers, sign in and breakfast went well. Geoff Roberts arrived with the Sun'n Ski Sports van providing courtesy on site equipment for some 10 or 15 first time skaters. Instructors Peter Buzzini, Gwen Laycock, Geoff Roberts, and Cindy Hill began organizing everyone at 10 a.m. as planned. This was the largest single group that they, The Roadmasters, had ever handled. Considerable thought in preparation for addressing the wants and needs of 51 wannabe to advance skaters was a challenge. Even with presignup self assigned ability ratings, no standards existed, making it difficult to set up class levels as is commonly done at ski schools.

Early on Peter Buzzini's suggestion that safety would be the best beginning became prophetically the right choice. Braking, falling, and basic balanced straight skating was examined and practiced by to approximately equally sized groups with two instructors each. One was primarily beginner and the other was the intermediate to advanced skaters. Beginners did amazingly well discovering the virtues of required protective gear as they practiced heel braking and forward balanced movement. The intermediates and advanced group

practiced much the same with more speed and deliberate falling. Postures and styles were critiqued and refined. Peter pointed out analogous technicalities between skating and skiing. The only serious departure between the two sports is braking.

At 11:30 a.m. our lunch by HB's arrived giving everyone time for some fine barbecue and shop talk. At 1:00 p.m., the second hour of instruction began with the beginners looking very smooth and in relative control of heel braking, straight balanced movement and simple turning. The intermediates and advanced divided into two groups and addressed scissoring over rough terrain, t-stops, backward skating, and a variety of other requested maneuvers. All groups made

extensive use of field cones to refine discipline and performance. It was a very impressive sight! What had begun more as strained chaos now appeared nearly choregraphed and smooth! In general, feedback from all participants was great. Only one or two expressed doubts about their future in skating... but those weren't final. They did not permit addressing ski pole technique, but Peter wants to get together to pursue this and other ideas for future workshops.




