

FROM THE SKI DESK

Welcome to ski month '96. February is well respected as the best time to find ideal snow conditions. We have scheduled five excursions during this period and if you are not signed up on a trip yet, there may be space available. Check the next page for the location you desire then call the TC and inform them of your interest. Last minute openings are sometimes difficult to fill and often

a well timed phone call may get you on a trip that appeared to have no space available.

In January Space City's ski season really got to moving along with trips to Park City, Utah; Aspen, Colorado; Heavenly Valley, Nevada/California; and Badgastein, Austria. More than 230 SCSCers began their 1996 ski year last month, and a few are still "lost in Europe" right now.

Back to February, Pam Smith, and Dana Wardell are heading to Sun Valley, Idaho on the 3rd with 40 club members. I understand ten more SCSCers wanted go so badly they made their own arrangements and plan to meet the rest there. Steamboat, Colorado is the destination of 66 participants on two Space City trips. TCs Charlotte Lynn & Deborah (Purdin) Christie assisted by respective ATCs Joe Cannata & Arlen Isham will be part of 362 Texans from eleven different Texas Ski Council clubs. The TSC Winter Shootout begins the 10th of the month with our shorttrip leaving on 2/14, Valentines Day. Presidents Day weekend will find 32 more members in New Mexico. Stan Broniak and Ken Shapley are hoping to find some fresh powder in Taos for their group. The following Saturday, 1/24, Debbie Warren and Barb Ehrlich are off to Big Sky, Montana. They plan a full week for the 36 participants with skiing & partying, as well as a

snowmobile excursion in Yellowstone Park. Lets hope the US Government cooperates and has the park open.

Speaking of the government, the recent shutdowns have created some real problems for many people. The air travel industry has had a dilemma arise as well. Due to our early ticketing, we were required to pay a 10% tax on tickets purchased in 1995 for 1996 travel. As of this writing refunds of this tax may be due to many of our participants. I have talked to several industry representatives, and different procedures of obtaining refunds are being implemented by the individual venders. If we can obtain the refund through the club it will be returned to you, however it may be necessary for each ticket holder to apply for his or her own refund. By all means hang on to your ticket stub after using it for travel. Your trip leader will get the necessary information to you ASAP.

We have passed final payment date for all trips, if you are late contact your TC. A diligent effort is made to secure payments from all participants, and if we don't have any word from you, we will look for a replacement. Until next month, see you on the ski slopes.





EVERYTHING YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT MEMBERSHIP,

BUT WERE AFRAID TO ASK!





The number of recent phone calls asking (Why didn't I get my Sitzmarke? When do I get my 'Membership Card?) prompted me to write this article to try and clear up some misunderstandings about membership in Space City. Here are some important things about your membership that you should and need to know

- 1. Membership is for a one year period from May 1 then April 30.
- 2. Memberships do not automatically renew. You must submit an application for renewal each year.
- 3. Renewal Period May 1 thru May 31. Advantages of Renewing within the renewal period.
 - A. Current members are given a \$5.00 Discount. Sponsorship signatures are not required for renewal
 - B. Qualifies you for early mail-in sign-up for ski trips.
 - C. Assures you of getting your or membership card mailed to you in your Sitzmarke.
 - D. Assures you of the continuation of your Sitzmarke.
 - E. Assures the continuation of your "Membership in Good Standing" which is required if you plan to apply for a position as Officer in SCSC. If you let your membership lapse you are not eligible to become an Officer.
- 4. New members cannot sign up until June 1, after all current members are given the opportunity to renew.
- 5. After the initial membership card mail-out in August for renewing members, cards are no longer mailed out during the year. New members can pick them up at the General Meetings.
- 6. The Sitzmarke is mailed out via bulk mail which means that it is not forwarded to a new address. If you change address during the year, send in the address change to the VP of Membership so it can be changed on the computer. The VP of Membership generates the mailing labels for the Sitzmarke.
- 7. Processing your application for membership can take up to four weeks, because it must go then an approval process by the Officers. Therefore, it may take 2 months for you in receive your first Sitzmarke Newsletter.

Trivia:

The most Frequently Asked Question of the V.P. of Membership is: What does the 'a' and 's' stand for on the membership application.



VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT


