Bye for now, see you on the slopes!!!







Texas Ski Week at Park City was pretty rough this year for our Space City gate bashers. Several racers did very well and some, like Susan Blome did better than ever. But..., not all was well. A fairly large number of our good racers DQ'd and some did not get to the race for one reason or another. Even though the course was not steep nor hard for intermediate skiers, it was tough for faster skiers because some of the widest gates were in the fastest part of the course. This caused more advanced racers to have trouble making all of the gates. Some didn't. Of course the other clubs had the same conditions or worse because we were the first to race. I'm sure because of all the above excuses, you've guessed by now that Space City didn't prevail over the other clubs in our division. We placed third behind Los Amigos and Lone Star. We actually beat Lone Star on gross points by having five more bronze medals. However, they were awarded handicap points because we have beaten them by large margins in the past. Los Amigos is another story. They had 119 racers out of 200 participants. We had 67


racers out of 120 participants. Even if all our participants had raced and done as well as possible, we could not have overcome the advantage that Los Amigos had by having so many racers. The bottom line was that we did pretty well under the circumstances and I think we all enjoyed the challenge of the race course. Even Sue Barnett, who took more time skiing the course than anyone else in the club, was heard exclaiming "I'm ready to run those gates again." In the individual races, our own George Hirasaki won first place in the senior men's division while Nelson Turner captured third. Nancy Lowrey was third in the senior women's division. Darlene Hirasaki, Lotty Gautschi, Maria Tramontin, Ron Honefinger and Kevin Bishop also represented SCSC very well in the individual races.

My thanks go to Maria Tramontin, Terry McGuinness, and Sharon Sequeira for doing a fine job as race directors for the three Park City Trips. I'm hoping I'll have good news to report at the next meeting from the results of racing at Steamboat.






