It's the dedication of our volunteers that makes this club great!



There may be some space left on the <u>Snowmass 2</u> trip.....see Nancy Sarff or Charles Butler for information. Also short on time and space is the <u>Val di Fassa</u>, Italy trip. You will never get a better European trip for the price!! See Peggy Montgomery...she may be able to get you a seat if the trip is sold out. You say you want a February trip with prime ski conditions, you might still find space available on our <u>Purgatory</u> trip. Join with other Texas Ski Council clubs for all the camaraderie and friendly competition. Louella Steller and Kathy Young have put together a nifty, nifty trip. Seldom do we get to put together a reasonably priced <u>Telluride</u> trip but Bill Bomberger and Joanne Fore have accomplished the near impossible by getting Telluride in at this price. There is still space on Breckenridge which is a really neat place to go. In addition to four great ski mountains at Breckenridge, the town is one of the hottest party towns on the ski circuit. Debbye Crofoot and Lady Freitag have a great location in ski- in condos and have some super party plans. PS.... I cannot confirm the rumor that <u>Jimmy Buffet</u> is participating on this trip. <u>Vail</u> is calling!! Sharon Inman has lodging near Lions Head Gondola. ATC Pamela Whitfield has special sites located nearby for the social activities. No bussing at the resort to get to the other side of the freeway for the evening!!! If you still can't decide where you want to go, the perfect option is to sign up on wait lists. You receive the option of joining the trip as an opening becomes available, and there won't be a penalty if you decline. While some lists may seem to be too long, invariably as the departure date draws closer, more people have trouble committing. Trips with short or no wait lists are Snowmass 2 and 3, Montreal, Whistler, and Sugarloaf. Remember, if you don't get on the wait list the TC won't know you're interested.

New this year is the emergency wait list. This wait list will be in addition to the normal wait list for each trip. Those who can leave at a last minute's notice will discover this may be a great cost savings for you! See VP Trips or DOTS for details or sign up.....price is only \$5.00.

One very important note. Our ticketing needs to be very exact concerning names. Each participant over 18 must provide PHOTO ID when checking baggage, and when boarding. This ID must match the name on the ticket. Trip leaders will do their best to acquire your exact name. Please assist by checking the spelling they have for you at the pre-trip parties, and on any trip correspondence. Late cancellations will be affected as we may incur a penalty making last minute name changes.

A word about final payments and cancellations. While we have passed this time period on many trips, some problems have arisen. It is your responsibility to get payments to the TC by the final payment date. If you fail to do so you may be replaced. Please inform the Trip Coordinator as soon as possible of any problems you may encounter. If you intend to cancel you must notify the club, *in writing*, on or before the final payment date of your intention. Failure to do so may incur the loss of all monies. While we have had good luck in the past at securing replacements for canceled participants, it's always a gamble. The more time you give the trip leaders to replace you, the better your chance at securing a refund. Don't forget a cancellation fee will be deducted from any refund.





Super-sidecuts Are Changing The Way We Ski

Skiing is a sport rife with trend and rumor. There is always some new piece of equipment on the horizon that will transform you into the skier of your dreams. Those who dutifully try each new product have grown understandably skeptical.

The promised dramatic changes, if there at all, are usually subtle enough only to be discerned by the best and hardest skiers. But now something different approaches. This is a change for every man and woman of every level of ability. Enter the PARABOLIC SKI.

√ What Is It?

While everything else has changed around it, the shape of the ski has remained essentially the same until now. A parabolic ski is a ski with a whole new shape. The ski has a radical side cut creating a very deep interior curve.

If you look at the ski as it lies flat on the ground you will see that the tip and tail are almost one and one-half times as wide as the waist of the ski. This unique impression has also led the super-sidecut ski to be nicknamed the "hourglass ski".

√ What Does It Do?

Basically, it turns for you. Remember geometry? If you lay the ski on its edge, and apply pressure to the waist, it carves a turn. You just have to pick the edge to determine which way you want the ski to turn. The shape also renders a much more stable turn. Yes, this shape actually can help skiers put more carving and less skidding into their turns.

√ Who Should Use Them?

Anyone can improve their carving by skiing on these skis, but beginners and intermediates will notice the benefit most.

The ideal candidate for the parabolic innovation is the intermediate who has plateaued and does not anticipate ever getting enough time to really focus on improving. Just by snapping on the parabolics, this skier will carve turns like he never has before.

√ Are There Any Disadvantages?

Ski technicians report that the vast majority of people who demoed parabolics last year loved them. They take a little getting used to, of course. But the learning curve was brief for most. One tech even quoted studies that showed that beginners who were given parabolic skis learned faster, found skiing easier and had more fun.

But two types of skiers were noticeable unhappy with the innovation: high speed giant slalom skiers and "hot dogs." Both complained that the skis are not as stable at high speeds as they would like. Also, the skis always want to turn, thus making speed harder to attain.

Finally, we should note that you run the risk of being told that you are skiing on "cheaters" by some "hard-core types" who think that overcoming technical defects by using equipment is not sporting. "But then again," as one expert pointed out, "not everybody has fifty days to ski. For those with limits on the time they can devote to sport, the advantages probably outweigh the disadvantages."

√ Should You Run Out And Get Them?

Why not! Look at it this way, if you are an intermediate or a beginner looking for an easy way to improve your skiing, there is nothing quicker or simpler. None of your other equipment has to change -- and neither do you.

But take your time and look around before you invest. This season is expected to yield parabolics a-plenty. Virtually every ski manufacturer will be introducing a parabolic ski. And while word of mouth was good on last season's versions, there is no reason to make a hasty decision. Shop around and demo a few before deciding. Maybe that way your new skis will satisfy you until the next big thing comes along!


