Treasurer - Jill St. Clair





As this column is being written, the SCSC contingent skiing in the TSC FINAL SHOWDOWN at Mt. Bachelor, Oregon, is several days away from competing in the last NASTAR race of the season. Obviously, the final results will not be available until after publication of this month's Sitzmarke. Regardless of the outcome, whether we place first, second or otherwise, we just won't have enough total overall

points to win the Division I Silver Cup. As I mentioned in my January column, finishing dead last in the first TSC competition at Keystone proved to be our *Waterloo*, as we received only one point for our effort. The best case scenario at Mt. Bachelor would suggest that we might place second in the overall final standings; certainly a position short of our hopes and predictions. Is this a disappointment? Of course. I just hate when that happens! Yet winning the Silver Cup may not be the ultimate objective of SCSC. Considering that we have by far the largest membership of any club in the TEXAS SKI COUNCIL, we must provide many more ski trips in order to satisfy our 1400-plus members. Therein lies the rub. Other clubs have no more than seven trips at the most, and four of these are TSC NASTAR events. Thus, most of their best racers

are usually channelled into the four TSC sponsored NASTAR competitions; something that would be most difficult for SCSC to do since there are so many other trip options for **our** best skiers. As Club Race Director, I could, of course, encourage the participation of our most capable racers to compete head-to-head with our friendly opposition in every TSC sponsored trip; yet that might indeed impose an unfair obligation on these individuals. As important as winning may be, I feel that coercing our best skiers to race in mostly TSC events could be placing too high a price for a *silver triumph*. After all, this club was meant primarily for recreational skiing, camaraderie, and just having fun.

I'd like to make it clear that as Race Director, I'm certainly not placing a low priority on TSC NASTAR racing. I do believe however, that this club, in general, seems to have lost some of its interest and enthusiasm in competing against our traditional rivals. Perhaps next year we can regroup and regain our esprit de corps and prove once again to all that we really are the best!

Since this will be my last *Sitzmarke* message, I'd like to finish just as I began my first column by saying that it has been a real privilege to promote and coordinate the club's racing activities and I'd also say that being the Club Race Director is arguably the best, most interesting and enjoyable position in the entire club. I've enjoyed every minute of it!

APPLICABLE STANDING RULES OF SPACE CITY SKI CLUB, INC.

- 1.0 DUES. Dues shall be \$25 per single person and \$35 per married couple. Members who renew their current membership prior to June 1, will receive a \$5 discount per membership. Dues are non-refundable, may not be pro-rated, and may not be converted to couple status during the membership year.
- 5.0 TRIP PENALTIES.
 - 5.1 A. If a trip participant withdraws from a trip after the published final payment date, the trip participant will lose the entire payment upon withdrawal. If the participant can be replaced from the waiting list, the participant will be refunded the entire payment less any costs incurred by the Club in addition to cancellation fees as specified in 5.2. If the trip participant cannot be replaced from the waiting list, the participant will be refunded the amount which the Trip Coordinator is able to recover by cancellation of lodging, transportation, and/or other commitments less any costs incurred by the Club and cancellation fees as specified in 5.2.
 - B. If a trip participant fails to make final payment by the published final payment date, the trip coordinator may replace the participant after making a diligent effort to contact the participant, who will be subject to cancellation fees as specified in 5.2. (Effective 1/5/92)
 - 5.2 CANCELLATION FEES.
 - A participant may forfeit his full deposit if he fails to notify the Club in writing of his intent to withdraw prior to the published final payment dates. A minimum charge of \$30 will be assessed for each trip cancellation. (Effective 6/92)
 - 5.3 A charge of \$10.00 will be assessed for each trip transfer. A transfer will not be considered after final payment date unless a replacement can be secured. (Effective 9/21/92)
 - 5.4 Deposit, transfer and cancellation charges for non-domestic trips shall be determined by the Executive Committee and included in the trip release form as well as in all trip publicity; in no case shall these requirements be less than those provided in Sections 5.2 and 5.3 of these Standing Rules.
 - 5.5 NO SNOW.
 - If the Club encounters a cancellation situation prior to the departure of a trip, the trip participant is entitled to recover the entire cost of the trip less charges incurred by the Club as a penalty for cancellation of lodging, transportation, operating expenses and/or other commitments made on behalf of a trip participant. Refunds to any trip will be made upon receipt by the Club of the total refund due the Club by the resort, airline and/or other entity or as approved by the Executive Committee.

7.0 RESTRICTIONS.

- 7.1 Allowing non-trip participants to occupy any room as a non-registered guest is strictly prohibited, and in violation of Club policy.
- 7.2 The illegal use of controlled substances and/or alcohol during Club trips, or any other official Club function, is in violation of Club policy, and is strictly prohibited.
- 7.3 No substitutions of trip participants shall be allowed without the knowledge and approval of the Trip Coordinator, and new additions to the trip shall come from that trip's Waiting List. The Trip Coordinator shall make all substitutions.
- 7.4 It is the policy of the Club not to allow the active solicitation of the general membership at a Club function or in the Club publication for any other than Club sponsored trips or activities without the consent of the Executive Committee.
- 7.5 No person may participate in a Club sponsored trip, or participant paid activity, without first completing a written and signed Release of Liability for that trip or activity, on a form approved by the Board of Directors.
- 7.7 A Club officer, Director or Director(s) of Trips shall not accept a gratuity in excess of \$25 from a vendor without giving notice to the Executive Commit-

MISCELLINEOUS.

- 8.1 SKI TRIP SIGN UP
 - A. No member shall be allowed to sign up for any ski trip prior to the September General Meeting except as designated by prior approval of the Executive Committee.
 - B. Each member may sign up for him/herself and one other member on any ski trip or ski trip waiting list.
- 8.2 WEATHER. If a trip should be "weathered-in" the additional lodging expense will be left up to the individual, although the Trip Coordinator will assist in making accommodation arrangements, and collection for same shall be left up to the lodge.
- 8.3 NON-SKI TRIPS/ACTIVITIES. Reservations for participation in such activities may require full payment, instead of a deposit fee.

APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY

I certify and recognize that SCSC is a non-profit organization, run entirely by volunteers who have no special training or experience at conducting trips or other activities and I do not rely on the expertise of any director or officer or their appointed representatives in conducting trips or activities. I am aware that SCSC carries no insurance nor maintains a reserve for liability.

I wish to participate on this trip or activity because SCSC provides me with the economics and discounts of group purchasing power, social interaction with compatible individuals, and does all the planning and reservation work for me.

In consideration of the above, I, for myself, my heirs, executors and assignees do hereby release and discharge SCSC, its directors, officers and any other person appointed by them, from all claims, damages, demands or actions whatsoever in any manner arising from my participation on this trip or activity. I agree that I am solely responsible for my personal safety and conduct. I also agree to indemnify and hold harmless SCSC, its directors, officers and agents, or contractors from any loss, cost, or expense, incurred by, or attributable in any way to me, in connection with this trip or activity.

I also certify that I have read, that I understand, and that I agree to abide by, all the Bylaws and Standing Rules of SCSC. I understand that payments made for trips or activities may not be refundable, in whole, or in part, and that all payments will be handled in accordance with the applicable provisions of the Bylaws and Standing Rules.

I hereby appoint SCSC, its directors, officers and agents, as my agent to perform all acts and to enter into, any, and all contracts as may be deemed desirable in connection with this trip or activity. I understand SCSC acts only as coordinator and accepts no responsibility for the services of any person, ski area, resort, airline, motor coach, hotel or any organization whatsoever rendering any of the services or accommodations being offered on this trip or activity. Trip and activity fees are based on current tariffs and are subject to change without notice.
