WE'REMOVING!! Our new general meeting location will be at the newly remodeled SOUTHWEST HILTON beginning with our September 11th meeting. It is located at 6780 Southwest Freeway (just west of Hillcroft on the north side of the freeway).

With this move we've tried not only to obtain an easily accessible meeting location (which isn't easy for a group as large as SCSC), but also to address some of the concerns heard in the past. The SOUTHWEST HILTON has a large security patrolled parking lot which should provide ample parking. In addition to the ballroom area, there is a lovely atrium area where you can relax prior to the meeting (unless

TRIPS

We are also increasing the availability of land packages and short trips this season.

Please read Merrel Smith's article carefully for early sign-up instructions. make it even more difficult, the Texas Ski Council is designating the Mammoth trip as their Snowboard/Cross Country trip, so I encourage all you "shredder wannabes" to consider this trip!


WINDSURFING

One other note worth pointing out, at this time there are only 60 Full Packages available between Park City I & II for Traditional. I have reserved room space for 24 more people in the event enough participants use "Land Packages", or we can acquire more air space. Now without further ado may I present to you...

The Fine Print

Mail-in Sign-Up: HERE IT IS! Your chance to get an early berth on your favorite SCSC ski trip(s) for 1995-1996. The mail-in sign-up form is in this issue of the Sitzmarke, so copy it or clip it out and follow the

instructions below. Then, come to the September meeting at the Hilton Southwest to verify your registration and pick up additional

information the TC will have for you.

Mail-in sign-up begins on Monday, August 14 and ends on Friday, August 25. Your sign-up envelopes must be postmarked on or between these dates. (Registration received with postmarks outside these dates will be held until the September General Meeting. If you visit the trip table you may be added to the trip at that time space permitting.)

You must be a current member in good standing. In general this means you should have renewed your membership prior to August 1st (as mentioned in July's From the Ski Desk...). Your 1995-96 membership number should be shown on the mailing label for the August Sitzmarke. Call your VP of Membership Ted Bergeron, if you have questions.

You may sign-up yourself and one other SCSC member per trip (or family members for the family optional trip see

By-Law 2.8.A. in your club directory).

- In the registration envelope include the trip registration form and your deposit. The deposit for the Badgastein trip is \$300 per participant. The deposit on all other trips is \$100 per participant. Checks should be made payable to "SCSC" and should have your membership number and the trip name listed on the check.
- Mail your registration to the Trip Coordinator for the trip on which you wish to participate. TC's names and addresses for all trips are listed in this Sitzmarke. If your registration is mailed to anyone other than the TC, it will be returned to you and you will not be registered for the trip.
- If the postmark is correct and the registration meets the above guidelines, names will be added to each trip's Participant List in the order received. If a trip's participant roster fills during mail-in sign-up, additional registrations received will be added to a Wait List in the order received. Checks for wait-listed members will be held by the TC until a space becomes available on the trip. Participants checks will be deposited on or after August 31st.
- These procedures apply to ALL members (except the trip's TC and ATC) and all Trip Participants are subject to SCSC Standing Rules, Policies and Procedures.
- 8. SCSC is not responsible for any problems with the U.S. Postal Service, including delayed delivery or lost mail.
- 9. Information shown on the Trip Schedule is subject to change. Contact the TC or ATC for up-to-date info.
- Any registrations received which do not meet the above qualifications may be returned to the sender.

Land Packages: Due to the overwhelming response last season, the Executive Committee has approved Land Packages to be available on most of this year's trips. On some trips there will be a limited number of land packages available, if all are filled you will be given the option of being on a "Land Wait List" or switching to a full package.

Because of the restrictions noted below for land packages, be sure you have concrete travel arrangements made before you sign up for one of these. SCSC will not be responsible for any difficulties or extra expense you incur due to delayed or canceled flights or other transportation problems.

Rules and restrictions for Land Packages

- Land packages include everything available on the full package except air. Ground transportation will be included and will be available to land package participants if they can meet the group at the destination airport on time. Ground transportation will <u>not</u> be delayed for land package participants arriving later than the group.
- Other than the full package, this is the only package price available; no other combinations of lodging and/or transportation will be offered. (note: As in the past, members may still arrange their own transportation, lodging, etc., and pay only for the parties and trip options. If so, please arrange to do this in advance, ideally by the pre-trip party.)
- Normal cancellation and transfer policies apply with the added stipulation that, on or after final payment date, land package participants must be replaced from a land package wait list and full package participants must be replaced from a full package wait list in order to transfer or receive a refund.
- It will not be possible to convert your trip from land package to full package, or vice versa, after final payment date. Airline commitments can not be changed by the Club after that date.
- If you sign up for land package, please notify the TC of your transportation plans in advance of the trip. The TC can tell you where to meet the group or other pertinent information.








Two of our members, BOB OLSEN & LORI MATHEWS are
