## FROM THE SKI DESK

Happy Holidays to all. Our ski season is off and rolling with our first trip having just returned from Copper Mountain. Now, I'm writing this before we leave, but the early snowfall in the Rockies is helping to forecast a great Thanksgiving trip.

If you haven't selected a trip yet, may I suggest an excellent bargain in January, **Aspen.** Trip leaders, Dee Dee

& John, have put together a really dynamite package on what promises to be a fun trip. You say you want a February trip with prime ski conditions, you might still find space available on our **Steamboat** trips. Join with other Texas Ski Council clubs for all the camaraderie and friendly competition. Check with the TCs Charlotte Lynn(long trip) or Deborah Purdin(short trip) for details.

If you still can't decide where you want to go, the perfect option is to sign up on wait lists. You will get the option of joining the trip when an opening becomes available, and there won't be a penalty if you decline. While some lists may seem to be too long, invariably as the departure date draws closer more people have trouble committing. Trips with short or no wait lists are Winter Park, Park City I & II, Badgastein, Big Sky, Mammoth & Vail. Remember, if you don't get on the wait list the TC won't know you're interested.

One very important note brought to my attention concerns a problem we may encounter at the airports. Our ticketing needs to be very exact concerning names. Each participant over 18 must provide PHOTO ID when checking baggage, and when boarding. This ID must match the name on the ticket. Trip leaders will do their best to acquire your exact name. Please assist by checking the spelling they have for you at the pre-trip parties, and on any trip

correspondence. Late cancellations will be affected as we may incur a penalty making last minute name changes.

I feel I should say something about final payments and cancellations. While we have passed this time period on many trips, some problems have arisen. It is your responsibility to get payments to the TC by the final payment date. If you fail to do so you may be replaced. Please inform the Trip Coordinator as soon as possible of any problems you may encounter. If you intend to cancel you must notify the club, in writing, on or before the final payment date of your intention. Failure to do so may incur the loss of all moneys. While we have had good luck in the past at securing replacements for canceled participants, it's always a gamble. The more time you give the trip leaders to replace you, the better your chance at securing a refund. Don't forget a cancellation fee will be deducted from any refund.

I want to send best wishes to TC Llona Doubet and ATC Dave Schein on their upcoming trip to Winter Park and everyone going along for the best snow possible. I hope to see everybody at the Monthly Meeting on December 11, to help the Sunshine Kids.



# **RACEY NEWS**

Here goes!...This is the umpteenth time someone has tried to explain the Nastar handicap system. The system was probably invented by a former golfer who had too many triple bogeys. NASTAR is an acronym for "NAtional STAnfard Race." Nastar handicaps are similar to golf handicaps in that they are dependent on how much your time (score) is slower than (over) par time (par for the course). Par time is the time it would theoretically have taken the fastest racer in the country to ski the same course you are skiing. In golf you have an advantage if your handicap is high because it is subtracted from your raw score to determine your competition score. With racing, your handicap is your raw score and you don't subtract it from anything. The faster you ski, the lower your handicap will be. Contrary to what many people

believe, your handicap is not affected by your age. One of the advantages of being older (believe me there aren't many) is that you can earn a medal with a handicap higher than some hot-shot 39 year old kid would need for the same medal.

The good news!...Admittedly, it is difficult to earn a gold, silver, or bronze medal in club races. However, thanks to Ted Bergeron, Dale Allbritton, and others, Space City has medals for those racers who ski fast enough to earn points for the club on TSC trips without being quite fast enough to earn a bronze medal. These medals are called "challenger" medals and they are very nice looking. They are available to racers on all club ski trips. Just to give you an idea of how the "challenger" system works, we can assume that an intermediate, female, forty-something skier just came cruising down the Nastar course without falling or missing a turn. If it takes her twice as long to ski the course as it takes an average resort pace-setter, she would have a handicap of 105 and earn a green "challenger" medal. She would also earn 9 points for Space City if she were on a TSC trip. All intermediate and many experienced green slope skiers are able to ski at that level, or better, most of the time. The Nastar courses we usually race are on easy intermediate slopes. The whole point of this article is that earning a medal is not as difficult as some skiers think and you don't have to stress yourself or try to ski above your ability to have fun and be competitive. I encourage all ski trip participants to take a race clinic or two and discover the joy of successfully completing a Nastar race course.

The Utah Resort section offers info for the resort you access. Each area has available Resort Information, Trail Maps, Lift Ticket Information, Ski School, Lodging and Mountain Dining. A interesting feature is comments left by other Internet browsers rating each ski area. You also have the ability to leave your own comments.

The Transportation Section has shuttle schedules and costs out of Salt Lake City. There is also a connection to many of the ski web sites on the Internet. I recommend anyone skiing Park City this year to check out this site and watch the snow reports.



I want to use the next few columns to tell you about the various "high profile" appointed volunteer positions that are available with Space City Ski Club. The Board of Directors appoints an Audit Committee Chair, Texas Ski Council (TSC) Delegate and Alternate Delegate, while the Executive Committee approves the Assistant Treasurer and Directors of Trips. (The Excom also approves all Trip Coordinators, Ass't Trip Coordinators and Activity Coordinators, but these particular positions will not be discussed in this series.) The Vice-President of Trips selects the Race Director and the Secretary selects one or more individuals to assist with the selling of logos, etc. This month the focus will be on the positions appointed by the Board and in the

following months I will discuss the other positions.

The Audit Committee Chair is appointed at the first quarterly meeting of the Board. According to Article 5.5 of the Club's Bylaws the Committee Chair shall report to the Board at each of the following quarterly meetings regarding the accuracy of the financial statements and the adequacy of the current financial systems. You will find that Standing Rule 11.0 delineates how the Audit Chair is to perform the duties of the office, but a review of that rule will quickly make you aware that the Audit Chair has to review not only the various officers' budget to see that they are on track, but every activity, trip and accounting of money received or spent by the Club. Obviously the Audit Chair works in tandem with the Treasurer and Ass't Treasurer. It clearly helps to at least have an understanding of accounting principles, but necessarily requires that the person be familiar with the Club's various monetary transaction forms.



This year JEFF SARFF was appointed to be Audit Chair. Jeff has been a member of Space City since 1989. He has been actively involved in several activities and was the Trip Coordinator for the '95 Mt. Bachelor trip. Jeff has routinely gone on a couple of trips with the Club every year and you will often find him at the top of the Race Course on race day as he has been a Trip Race Director for a number of the trips on which he has participated.

The other appointed positions by the Board are the TSC Delegates. These positions under Standing Rule 10.10 are filled by current or past members of the Board of Directors and that rule also sets out the duties of the office. The Delegates are SCSC's liaison with the Texas Ski Council Board of Delegates and represent the Club in all matters brought before the Board of Delegates. These positions are the voice of Space City for the Texas Ski Council and they must be informed as to what issues are important to SCSC. The TSC Delegates meet four times a year at various large cities in the state. SCSC's Delegates, along with its officers and board members, also participate in the TSC Bid meeting which takes place in April of each year in San Antonio. It is at this meeting that SCSC's delegate coordinates

with the incoming and outgoing SCSC Vice-President of Trips to work with other clubs in considering ski areas for the Council Trips.

This year SHARON SMITH is the TSC Delegate. Sharon joined SCSC in 1989 and has actively participated in SCSC the last four years. Not only has she volunteered as an activity and trip coordinator, but she was the Club's secretary for the 1994-

95 ski season. She is currently on the Board. Sharon is also coordinating the 1996 TSC summer event along with a member of the Clear Lake Area Ski Club. Watch for more information on this TSC event.

**KAYLEEN KILL** was appointed to the Alternate Delegate position. While she only acts as the delegate if the appointed SCSC delegate is unable to attend a meeting, she is still encouraged to attend all the TSC meetings. Kayleen joined SCSC in 1990 after moving to Houston. She came with experience having been involved in a Ski Club previously. Like Sharon, Kayleen has been an activity coordinator (particularly for golf tournaments) and trip coordinator. She was the club treasurer during the 1993-94 ski season as well as on the Board in 1994-95.

If you have the opportunity take the time to visit with these individuals and find out more about their positions. They are all very enthusiastic about volunteering!
