

By the way, "THANKS" to all of you participants on the Snowmass trip who have been so understanding about the "air dilemna". BIG MOUNTAIN has 35 of the 40 spaces filled. There may be a possibility of getting the airfare and rooms back if we have more people interested. Call Linda ar Eric ASAP. CHAMONIX is FULL with 34 and no wait list. TELLURIDE is FULL with a wait list of ten. TAOS has 40 and has 2 spaces available. (Remember the price of this trip includes lift tickets.) VAIL is FULL with 10 on the wait list. Last month my article indicated BANFF was full. BUT.... things change so quickly! There are still approximately ten spaces left on BANFF so give Cheryl or George a call and let them know you're interested. All sorts of factors go into the decision to cut the trip back so please don't hesitate if you think you may want to join in this TSC trip. The Canadian Rockies are gorgeous, and this destination is sure to be a unique experience with lots of options. It may be a little "pricey" relative to other trips (primarily due to airfare), but I have been told by people who have been there that it is well worth it. The accomodations are in the landmark BANFF SPRINGS HOTEL which is an adventure in and of itself. Please act quickly if you are interested in Banff, Taos or Big Mountain.


