




From the Ski Desk...





s I WRITE this article (early January) the Breckenridge and Sunlight trips have been successfully completed, and Snowmass I, II and III, Big Mountain, Chamonix and Telluride are all filled to capacity and eagerly awaiting departure. It is hard for me to believe, but as you READ this article, one-half of our trips scheduled for this ski season have already come and gone. WOW!!! In addition, as of January 31st, all final payment dates have passed.

Of the remaining eight trips, there are two which have not filled to capacity. WHERE ARE ALL OF YOU PEOPLE WHO WANTED US TO RUN ATRIPTOLAKETAHOE AND SNOWBIRD/ALTA????!!!! Each of these trips are only half full. If any of you are interested, please contact Karen Putney (Lake Tahoe) or Robert Reichek (Snowbird/Alta) ASAP!!!! In order to limit SCSC's loss exposure as a result of contracts, payment dates, penalties, etc., etc. these trips may have to be cut back or eliminated. SO..... Don't hesitate if you are REALLY interested in going and are willing to write a check. Some major decisions have to be made regarding the status of these trips and there are certain time restraints beyond which we cannot wait to minimize SCSC's liability. Our volunteers who are eagerly running these trips have done a lot of "behind the scenes" work. I am telling you, SCSC's general membership, this because even though a trip doesn't leave until March, you cannot wait until then to make your profit organization, SCSC has to take extra measures not to lose its (YOURS/ OUR) money. This means much effort has already been expended by the volunteers to find lodging, etc. at places which will work with us to hold reservations without SCSC putting up mega bucks. That is why final payment ski conditions. dates are several months earlier than when a trip actually leaves. SCSC does not normally commit itself without having enough money in hand. Your initial trip deposit generally covers the deposits SCSC has to put up for airfare, lodging, etc. BUT..... if SCSC doesn't receive your final payment on time (or if a trip does not fill) then there's not else does, too! enough money to make the next payment per the airfare or lodging agreement. At that point, decisions have to be made regarding the status of whether a trip goes or not. I am explaining this to you so each member (who reads this!) has a better idea of all that goes on behind the scenes. This is not real obvious when you see all the eager and enthusiastic volunteers soliciting their trips at meetings and happy hours. Each volunteer has a vested interest simply due to the amount of time they have spent trying to help make their trip "GO."

Please check the 1993-1994 Ski Trip Schedule for last minute updates on each remaining trip's status regarding availability and/or wait list. Don't hesitate to get on a wait list because a lot of times something happens at the last minute and someone has to cancel off the trip. You may be number 8 on the waitlist, but the seven people in front of you may have already chosen another option or cannot go and just didn't remove themselves from the wait list. Which reminds me, if you are on a wait list on any of the eight remaining trips and you know you can't go, please

5th - C&W Night with dinner at the Tin Hall in Cypress


11th - Darts Tournament at Big John's Neighborhood Bar

TEXAS SKI COUNCIL REPORT

On December 11, 1993 the quarterly meeting of the Texas Ski Council was held in Houston. The SCSCers attending were Ted & Debbie Bergeron, Kim Page, Jerry Montgomery, Craig Liebergot, Sharon & Merrel Smith, Jim Edwards and Ed Cain.

Before the meeting began the 1993 Oshman's Houston Downhill trophy was ceremoniously presented to Space City Ski Club by our friends with the Clear Lake Ski Club. The night of the downhill ski race the score was erroneously totaled and the trophy presented to Clear Lake.

TSC President Rhonda McGree called the meeting to order; 16 of the 19 clubs were represented. The total number dropped from 20 as the Texas Renegades did not renew their membership.

We welcomed a new TSC sponsor Sun & Ski Sports. In a brief talk given by Sun & Ski president, Barry Goldmore, he said all members of clubs belonging to TSC will be given a 10% discount on all merchandise. This is a special privilege so carry your SCSC membership card and be sure to thank them. PS-there has been some confusion about this policy with some of the sales personnel but the store managers are informed.

Members of the TSC nominating committee are Jack Macey, Tim Waynecoop and our Craig Liebergot. Nominations are due March 1, 1994.

This year's bid package will emphasize travel as well as accommodations. Brenda Herman, Kenny Maden, Glenda Lehieh and our Debbie Bergeron are on the pre-select committee. The pre-select committee needs input from the clubs on where they want to go. All clubs were again reminded to vote for only trips their members will attend.

The TSC trip comps have been extended to the TSC Race Director, our Ted Bergeron, by the TSC board of directors. Ted clarified the following race rule. "Racers must race with their

home club if the club is on the trip, even if, they came with another club. If the racer has a dual membership, the racer must race with the club with which they came. Another question Ted brought up that is to be resolved at a future meeting, "Should the VP of a TSC trip be allowed to permit a former ski racer to race? If so, should they have raced 5, 10, 20, or 30 years ago?"

Dave Corbin, VP Marketing, thinks the best traveling prices for the clubs may be working through a travel agency. After contacting several agencies, Dave has been working with Journeys Unlimited. This may be of particular benefit to the small clubs of the council.

Richard Davidson of Ski Austria gave a lengthy but informative talk "Where we are going as a ski industry?" Highlights of the talk: last year the US industry had 54 million skier-days with approximately 10 million skiers. Skiing is a mature industry. Ten years ago 75% of skiers were under 35 years. Last year 45% were under 35. Ten years ago there were 845 ski areas, now there are only 529 areas. Small areas have been the fatalities. Ski equipment factories are running at 50-60% capacity. There are 2150 ski clubs in the US with 880,000 members.

The summer bash to be held in Corpus Christi on June 23-26 will be known as the "Summer Meltdown" this year. It was decided not to select a permanent name at this time.

The officers training seminar will be held on a Saturday in July, not in conjunction with the Summer Meltdown. Members of the training committee are Glenda Lehieh, Don Thomas, and our Dick Howard and Debbie Bergeron.

The TSC Cookbook is ready to go with 160 recipes; SCSC has agreed to take 50 books to sell, see the "Logo Ladies".


