

DID YOU KNOW.....

THAT THERE ARE SPECIFIED RESTRICTIONS ON CLUB TRIPS?

* SCSC Standing Rules strictly prohibit allowing a non-registered trip participant to occupy any room as a non-registered guest, and that violation of Club policy subjects the member to disciplinary action. (Standing Rule 7.1) This means that under no circumstances are guests or visitors who are not Registered Trip Participants allowed to bunk on your sofa or sleep on the floor or elsewhere in your room, condo, inn, lodge, townhome, private jacuzzi, etc.!

* SCSC Standing Rules require that Space City sell only full trip packages to our members. Although we cannot accommodate those desiring partial packages, they are welcome to make their own arrangements separately and pay SCSC and/or Texas Ski Council guest fees to participate in group functions at the ski resort. (Standing Rule 8.7)



CAYMAN UPDATE....

Do you dream of diving in warm, clear Caribbean Sea water with no current? How about magnificient coral reefs, dramatic drop-offs, winding tunnels and canyons, beckoning shipwrecks, marine life, all in water featuring 100-150 foot visibility? Then join SCSC on a trip to **Grand Cayman Island** for five fabulous days of diving and snorkeling over the Memorial Day weekend!

Grand Cayman is a British Colony and the largest of three islands that are the peaks of an undersea mountain range towering 12,000 feet above the sea bottom. It is 22 miles long and 4–8 miles wide, supporting a population of 22,000. Cayman Airlines will fly us there in a Boeing 737, completing the 1200 mile journey non-stop in 2 hours 40 minutes.

We'll be staying at the **Sunset House Hotel**, a dedicated dive resort located only one mile south of scenic Georgetown and right at the water's edge, on the island's "iron shore" a southwest shore. A giant stride puts you in twelve feet of water and a short swim to a reef. The hotel facility includes a restaurant (breakfast is included), a dedicated dive center (Sunset Divers), air conditioned rooms, a thatched bar, and a fresh water pool.

The dive boats leave from the hotel pier for a short ride of 5–25 minutes to the dive sites. The 2-tank daily boat dives and unlimited shore diving included in the dive package, an optional trip to Sting Ray City to observe and feed the tame rays, and an optional 3-tank computer day on the new, fast Manta, make this a must trip for divers.

Snorkelers will have a ball viewing the shallow reefs off shore from the hotel and the sting rays in the twelve foot deep water at Sting Ray City.

If you are a non-diver, fear not, Cayman appeals to all! Scenic Georgetown in only a mile away and provides lots to do with the abundance of shopping, dinner cruises, submarine rides, golf, sightseeing to the world's only turtle farm and to "Hell" and more shopping!

Membership in Space City is not a prerequisite to join the group for this trip, so tell your friends and introduce them to SCSC!

"Horsky" Hirasaki won third place in the senior men's division. You need to ask LOUISE POTTER about Alex's prize!!




After the Awards Ceremony, those who had time, went to Fuddruckers for Post Turnament festivities and food.
