



We wish all the nominees much success and express to them our sincere thanks for volunteering to serve their club.



# TEXAS SKI COUNCIL REPORT

The Texas Ski Council meeting was held in Houston on December 14, 1991. TSC Treasurer, **Steve Gucker**, presented a year to date financial report. The TSC application for tax-exempt status with the IRS was approved.

The Council appointed two committees; the Nominating Committee and the Pre-Select Bid Committee. The Nominating Committee members are Gary Kuchcinski, Chairman, Clear Lake Area Ski Club (Houston), Pris Scott, Texas Twisters (Lubbock) and Neil Martin, Austin Skiers (Austin). They will propose a slate of officers at the next delegates meeting in April, at which time nominations may be taken from the floor. The Pre-Select Bid Committee club members are Glenn Strother, Texas Renegades (Dallas/Fort Worth), Rollo Gurss, Texas Twisters (Lubbock), Laura Kuchcinski, Clear Lake Area Ski Club (Houston) and Jack Macy, Capital Downhill (Austin). They will review bids from various resorts for the 1992–93 ski season. The committee will then select those resorts that will present their bids at the April delegates meeting. Additionally, Billy Lynum is planning to form a committee to look into realigning racing in each division.

**James Mershon**, V.P.-Marketing, reported that resorts who plan to bid have been asked to look into traveling Saturday to Saturday, as well as, Monday to Monday. By traveling on Monday, James said that it could lower the cost of a trip by \$200-\$250.



One possible destination for the Texas Expedition that is being researched is a ten day trip to New Zealand. Additionally, Chile and Argentina will bid for the Texas Expedition. The Council is looking into possibly offering a trip during "off time" for never-ever skiers. A committee has been formed to look into this. Perhaps an award will be given as an incentive for the never-ever skier

SCSC's **Peggy Donley** is the chairperson for the Summer Fun Olympics that will be held at the woodlands June 12–14, 1992. Peggy and the Steering Committee have put together what promises to be a fun-filled week-end, so mark your calendars. ## PROPOSED CHANGES TO BY-LAWS AND STANDING RULES APPROVED BY THE SCSC BOARD OF DIRECTORS JANUARY 5, 1992

### **BY-LAWS**

### ARTICLE 4.0: NOMINATION AND ELECTION OF OFFICERS

4.4 NOMINATING COMMITTEE. There shall be a Nominating Committee of seven members appointed by the President and approved by the Executive Committee prior to the September Regular Meeting. Not less than four nor more than five past officers of the Club, shall serve on this committee. Current officers shall be ineligible to serve. Only persons who have been members in good standing for the preceding twelve months shall be eligible for membership on this committee. The Nominating Committee shall adhere to written guidelines approved by the Board of Directors.

### STANDING RULES

The Board of Directors approved the following additions to the Space City Ski Club Standing Rules at the quarterly meeting on January 5, 1992.

- 3.3 TRIP COORDINATORS AND ASSISTANT TRIP COORDINATORS
  - Receiving complementary goods or services with a value of \$25 or more as the result of a group booking must be reported to the Vice President Trips within 14 days. These will first be offered to the Trip Coordinator and secondly to the Assistant Trip Coordinator for their sole use on that trip.
- 5.1 FINAL PAYMENT

If a trip participant fails to make final payment by the published final payment date, the trip coordinator may replace the particiant after making a diligent effort to contact the participant, who will be subject to cancellation fees as specified in 5.2.




