

recognition it's due -- so let it be known that these four ladies are exceedingly talented, incredibly organized, have boundless energy, and are as busy or busier than I am in their real jobs -- yet somehow they all manage to find the time to do a wonderful job on behalf of SCSC and our skiing members!

How many of you out there know that our MAIL-IN SIGNUP began just two years ago? And how many of you know that mail-in signup is a process that has to be approved by each year's new Executive Committee? The mass majority of you will be happy (relieved?) to learn that this year's trip signup will once again be by mail! Most of our seasoned members have "fond" memories of what the September Signup Rush was like for all those years — and who knows, you may get to experience it some year in the future!

TRIP SIGNUP IS A MONUMENTAL TASK for a volunteer club of our size, and the only way to feasibly conduct it is with the assistance of a "SIGNUP COMMITTEE", which this year will be composed of TCs, ATCs, DOTs, Officers, Board Members and myself. So, be sure to convey your thanks to each one of them when you find out who they are — because of their extra efforts, you won't have to endure countless hours in prolonged, tedious lines to get on a trip!

DETAILS FOR TRIP REGISTRATION will be explained in the August Sitzmarke — but the inside word is that it will begin Monday, August 17th and run through August 31st. {FAIR WARNING to those who try to beat the system: Any envelopes postmarked August 16th or earlier will go directly to the papershredder — no exceptions!} And if you miss the August 31 deadline, you can sign up at the September 14th meeting, which will be quite tame and normal since the rush will have occurred through the U. S. Postal System! And the rest of you can come for the festivities, confirm that you got on the trip(s) you wanted, and pick up any trip information your TCs and ATCs may have for you!

YOU'RE PROBABLY WONDERING / OUT TRIP PRICES — AREN'T WEALL?! ROUGH ESTIMATES to expect are: Anywhere from \$500 to \$600 for 5 day trips, \$600 to \$750 for 7 day trips, and \$1250—ish for the 9 day Innsbruck trip. After the prices are finalized and budgets approved in early July, they will all appear in your August Sitz. So watch your mailbox the first week of August for all the details on how to get on one of the great trips lined up for our 1992–93 SKI YEAR!

THE OFFICE OF SCSC PRESIDENT

EDITOR'S NOTE: This the first in a series of articles on the Club offices. Over the nextrfew months information on all the offices will be provided. With this knowledge, the Executive Commttee hopes many of you will think seriously about putting your name in for an office come October !!!

The President's job can be the easiest or the hardest of the SCSC officer positions. It is certainly one of the most visible, and must bear the receipt of the most criticisms and also the most compliments. A strong network of officers, working together as a team with the President, presents the most positive and effective image for the Club. The purpose of this article is to explore some of the qualifications and responsibilities of the President, as well as mention some of the behind the scenes aspects of that office.

Eligibility for becoming an SCSC officer is to have been a member in good standing for the preceding twelve months. The office of President has the additional requirement that the candidate must have held or currently hold an elected position on the Executive Committee. This requirement insures that the President will be familiar with the By-Laws, Standing Rules, policies and procedures of the Club. The year spent in office and attendance at various meetings gives ample opportunity to watch and be involved with the inner workings of the Club and use that as groundwork for the President's job. Historically, most SCSC Presidents have "come up through the ranks" -- from Activity Coordinator or "frequent volunteer" to ATC, TC and Club officer. By that time those people are really interested in the five year job--one as President, one as Chairman of the Board of Directors and three spent as a member of the Board of Directors. Even after all of this, it is interesting to note that many of our past Presidents have continued their work and have been active as officers in the Texas Ski Council.


The primary responsibilities of the President as described in SCSC Standing Rules are to preside at all meetings, to supervise all aspects of the Club's operation and to perform all public relations duties. As mentioned earlier, those duties can be a piece of cake or an absolute nightmare. The President's job is made easier by the supportive framework of officers. When each officer meets the expectations of that office, the President maintains constant communication about the day-to-day workings of the Club and assists with trouble shooting and problem solving. If an officer is ineffective or has to vacate that office for some reason, the President may have to help with that position until the problem is resolved. As Bob Olsen wrote in an article similar to this several years ago, "All the President has to do is persuade others to do what they ought to do without persuasion". Easy!!!It is that feeling of teamwork with the Executive Committee that allows accomplishments as a group during the year; that provides an arena for sharing of ideas and complaints; and that continues to provide another link in the years of successful operation of SCSC.


Diplomacy is a key tactic for all of the President's dealings with others. As the leader of the Club, the President interacts with vendors, ski industry representatives, travel industry representatives, officers of other ski clubs, Texas Ski Council members and officers and members of SCSC. The President gets frequent calls from members; especially when they don't know who else to call. All calls are important and deserve a response. Part of the President's effectiveness will be judged on the ability to be responsive. Sometimes the results will be positive in nature, and sometimes the President will be required to "disagree without being disagreeable". The more skills in dealing with people that are brought to this office, the better.

Finally, the President's job is probably the most rewarding in the Club. The compliments are made when all is going well. It is very satisfying to watch others as they progress in leadership roles in the Club. This is a group of interesting, active people. Something is likely to be gained from every encounter. The President leads and the positive direction for SCSC continues.


