

The first big casualty occurred on that same day when Lee Morris tangled








"ROOKIE ROMP". Lois Nance at the starting gate, held into position by TC Joyce Ryan.

"It's not as bad as it looks; just snow plow your way down."


"Lawrence, I've been skiing for a total of one-half hours - you want me to go down this death slope? Cripes, I'm looking at an 80° slope!!"


Lawrence says, (Quoting a trendy TV ad) "Just do it."

## See and Ski Sight for Sore Eyes

# Proper sunglasses will prevent snow blindness

Eskimos sometimes use gogglelike bone shields with long, narrow slits to protect their eyes. Skiers have more fashionable sunglass options, but style should not replace protection. Reasons: The bright light can distort vision and cause snow blindness.

Ultraviolet keratoconjunctivitis -snow blindness, or sunburn of the eye - is caused by an overdose of ultraviolet (UV) radiation on tissues such as the cornea. Since the eye cannot detect UV energy, damage can occur in much the same way you get sunburned on an overcast day.

Fortunately, more than half the solar UV light that reaches the earth is filtered by ozone in the atmosphere, says Dr. Randall Olson, chairman of ophthalmology at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City. Most UV light reachng the eye is indirect.

But with ski resorts at high elevations, the filtering effect of the atmosphere is substantially reduced. Also, snow reflects 85% or more UV radiation, according to University of Utah studies.

Snow blindness often has a delayed reaction, typically six to 12 hours after exposure. The eyes appear red and irritated. There may also be a sensation of foreign objects or "sand" in the eyes, plus light sensitivity, tearing, and uncontrolled blinking or eyelid squeezing.

Most discomfort usually disappears within 48 hours. An ophthalmologist will likely recommend



staying indoors until symptoms disappear. So there goes the ski holiday.

The best prevention? Proper eyewear. Sunglasses must fit well and not distort vision. Eyewear with tinted or colorless, coated lenses - either plastic or glass - protects by absorbing most UV wavelengths.

■ Yellow tinted glasses absorb 100% of the UV as well as the *blue* region of visible light, the main component of atmospheric haze. They're great for sunny *and* foggy days.

■ Neutral gray or "smoked" tints absorb as much as 98% of the ultraviolet along with the warm infrared part of the spectrum. Grays don't distort colors and are very effective in bright sunlight.

■ Green tints absorb infrared and 99% of the ultraviolet light but don't reproduce colors quite as well as the gray lenses. They're also less effective in bright sunlight.

**Brown** tints absorb UV light similar to the green, but they create greater color distortion.

■ Pink tints absorb more than 95% of all UV, plus some of the shorter wavelengths of visible light. But seeing the world through rosecolored glasses does not protect against glare.
