Congratulations to all participants and particularly to the medal winners. By now - Purgatory has returned, and the Heavenly Valley trips are on the way. A first place by either group assures the 1990 Division I Texas Ski Cup for Space City.

Nominations were presented at the February meeting for next year's officers, by Committee Chairperson Harold Eaton. Our thanks to the Wolf Creek area for being honest with us, by advising not to come because of marginal conditions. We will be refunding to those participants as soon as all funds have been returned to the Club Treasurer. We will do everything possible to expedite.
