

ALL 4 SUMMIT TRIPS NOMINEES FOR 1990-91 OFFICERS NEW ACTIVITIES -- MANY TO CHOOSE

HEAD OF THE LIFT LINE

As we hoped, our Summit groups won first place at Texas Ski Week. This was one of the closest finishes ever, and points out that every racer is important. Congratulations to all participants and particularly to the medal winners. By now - Purgatory has returned, and the Heavenly Valley trips are on the way. A first place by either group assures the 1990 Division I Texas Ski Cup for Space City.

Nominations were presented at the February meeting for next year's officers, by Committee Chairperson Harold Eaton. Their nominations were: Ray Naudain, President (also known as Ray Nau); Peggy Donley, Vice President - Programs: Craig Tharpe, Vice President - Trips; Kathy Morgan, Vice President - Membership: Jeri Hartman, Vice President -Publications; Kim Page, Secretary; and Mike Rooney, Treasurer. John Rice was nominated from the floor for Vice President of Trips. All nominees have indicated a willingness to serve and are qualified by their past involvement in the Club. For those of you on the Heavenly trip, ballots will be available at the airport and will be counted at the March meeting.



We will also be voting on a By-law change. This aligns us with a Texas Ski Council By-law which states that first time nominees for a Texas Ski Council office must have club approval.

Through a lot of hard creative work, Craig Tharpe (TC Snowbird) was able to secure a refund for each Snowbird participant with a minimal loss. Being able to convert an air cancellation penalty to the Vail trip cut the loss by \$3000.00. This was for-

tunate, but it's not a guarantee on future trips that are cancelled. After being postponed, the Wolf Creek Trip has also been cancelled. Our thanks to the Wolf Creek area for being honest with us, by advising not to come because of marginal conditions. We will be refunding to those participants as soon as all funds have been returned to the Club Treasurer. We will do everything possible to expedite.
