
ing of Sunday, February 28th. For further details on the above mentioned activities look for individual articles in the Sitzmarke.

LETTER TO THE STIZMARKE EDITOR

The December issue of the Sitz-marke contained Bill Kirk's Head of the Liftline column, which included a description of the process of nominating officers. It was timely and certainly informative. While his article appears to encourage folks to volunteer, I believe it is misleading in that members may believe that a volunteer must have run a trip to be considered for an office. Nothing is further from the truth.

Quoting Space City Ski Club By Laws Article 4.0, Nomination and Election of Officers, Section 4.3, Eligibility: "The only persons eligible to hold office shall be those who have been members in good standing for the twelve months preceding the Annual Meeting." Additionally, candidates for President shall have been or are currently an elected officer of the Executive Committee.

There is no requirement stating that potential officers must have run an activity or a ski trip. The By Laws do require that persons elected to the Board of Directors must have previously served as a Club Officer, Director of Trips, or Ski Trip Coordindator.

This experience is valuable for understanding the interworkings of the club, but as Bill states, outside experience also helps qualify people for a position. Space City Ski Club NEEDS volunteers to remain successful. We should encourage all interested and qualified folks to volunteer. These individuals can bring a fresh viewpoint to the club regardless of their previous level of involvement.

If in practice we only want or elect officers who have run trips, then change the By Laws. Otherwise encourage interested members to volunteer for any position. In that light, I would rather see the By Laws changed to allow any member in good standing to be elected to the Board of Directors.

WHAT WOULD YOU GET IF YOU LINED UP TEXAS SNOWSKIERS END TO END?

Well, in answer to the burning question, you get a line which would consider total number of skiers, total skier-days and total expenditures, not to mention ski destinations and favorite resorts.

Accordingly, the Texas Ski Council's recent survey of its member ski clubs on each club's 1986/87 season's programs (76% of TSC member clubs participated in this survey) shows that Texas skiers still get in their ski time, despite the economy in Texas. Excluding the very large trip taken to Badgastein, Austria in the 1985/86 season, skier-days produced at domestic resorts (including Canada) an increase of 20% in 1986/87. On all trips taken, a total of 3,890 skiers from those clubs responding, skied for a total of 18,683 skier-days.


But what does this mean to me, a participant? Well, last year the "Texas Ski Week - Traditional" trip alone represented only 1 of 4 of the TSC trips and generated 6,474 skier-days or 35% of the total. This volume is of extreme interest to ski resorts who want our business. It helps "save you money!!!" by keeping the trip and lift ticket prices low. Doing this keeps the Texas skier on the slopes enjoying this sport.

Ranking the ski destinations by states, Colorado is the most popular for our Texas ski clubs, followed by California and New Mexico. Colorado captuared over 70% of the Texas ski week trips in the 1986/87 season and remains very competitive as shown by three of four TSC trips that are going to Colorado.

This 1987/88 season as well, the

top four ski resorts were Steamboat. Keystone, Heavenly, and Crested Butte (all hosted the Texas Ski Cup Challenge series). Taos and Breckenridge following. The Winter Park resort, site of the 1987/88 "Texas Ski Week - Traditional" has proven to be a popular destination as evident by our five trips, or approximately 182 skiers to the area. This trip proves to be a good ski value for the Texas skier.

In summary, this survey data helps the Texas Ski Council work as a large buying block to show airlines our destination airports; ski resorts our skier-days and ski rental info, and ski club area summaries. This data is used to depict the potential impact the TSC clubs have within the ski industry, help the industry make informed decisions in dealing with the Texas ski market as well as to keep the Texas skier skiing!
