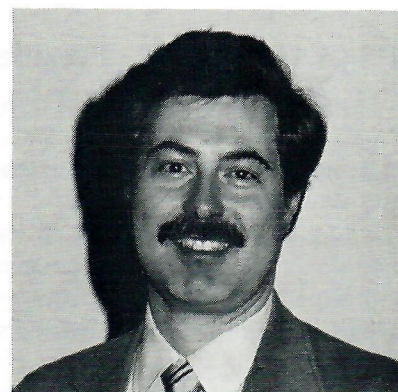
Officer Nominees for 1987-1988 Season

Involvement as an officer in nursing organizations, both local and national, will be helpful in preparing for her job as secretary.

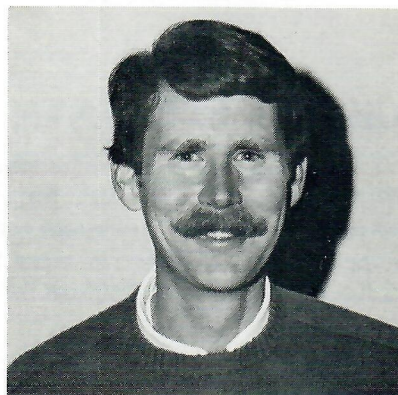
She looks forward to serving in that position and is happy to be representing SCSC.

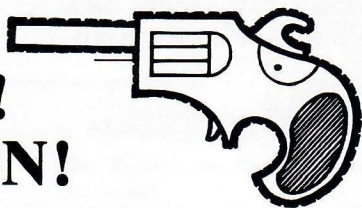

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

"A Profit Is Not Without Honor"

The Board of Directors wants to thank Gene Turboff and others for their written and verbal expressions concerning the size of the 1986-87 profit and the necessity of the large members' equity account. The questions raised call for a review of SCSC fiscal policy.

Space City is a non-profit corporation. All activities, skiing and otherwise, are budgeted to break even. Annually, in these pages, the Corporate Income and Balance Sheets are printed for our review and you can see how an average trip juggles tens of thousands of dollars and ends with an almost zero balance. The Board devotes most of its attention to insuring that the club officers produce and adhere to a budget which matches income and expense. In turn, the officers hold trip/activity coordinators' feet to the fiscal fire. The result is an all volunteer organization that produces a significant entertainment activity, an average of one a week during the program year, and does so within our means.

Last year we "made" over \$9,000 which, when added to past successes, produced a members' equity approaching \$30.00 each. Some say that these amounts are obscene and should be reduced. The solutions to these excesses include renewing one's membership at no cost, subsidizing ski trips by a nominal amount - as has been done before, and/or sponsoring one hell of a party.

The Board has considered these and other proposals for reducing the balance. We find a serious problem in determining the equity of any approach. Is it fair to renew the membership at no cost to non-participants when the surplus results from successful activities, cancellation fees and interest earned? Why just subsidize ski trips when fewer than a third of our members ski? Future actions await the response of future Boards. This year's group have elected to do nothing for the reasons outlined below.

We function in an increasingly

risky business that requires the maintenance of reserves for possible financial failures. Several years ago, the Club lost about \$6,000 - from operations, and this year had it not been for speedy actions and a few answered prayers, we could have lost several thousands on our inability to meet trip commitments.

Secondly, our working capital requirements are growing with the complexity of the travel business (*checked on the number of failed travel agencies lately?*). The airlines and resorts are requiring larger deposits sooner to insure our receiving timely departures and the accommodations we must have to be competitive. We operate on a negative cash flow for the early months of our new year. By the time you face final payment date, all of the money is committed and much has already been spent. The surplus we maintain to pro-

vide this working capital has shown very little inflation adjusted growth since the mid 70's.

The challenge which your Board feels is to insure the delivery of a recreational product, as required by the Bylaws, at a cost that is more than competitive, and in a style that encourages the continuity of the organization without exposing the membership to financial risk. SCSC enjoys an almost unique reputation among comparable clubs in meeting this challenge. Our success is history and our future is fragile.

It is the Board's conclusion that it would be imprudent to dissipate the equity. Besides, we will soon be 25 years old. And, who knows, we may want to throw one hell of a party!
