I he March meeting is officially designated as the "annual" meeting. The By-Laws require that an election of officers be held at this meeting. Election shall be by written ballot unless there is only one nominee for each office. Since there is only one nominee for each office, the election shall be by voice vote. Again, many thanks and congratulations to the nominating committee. They selected such qualified people that their recommendations were not challenged. This has not always been the case. As recently as last year the judgement of the nominating committee was severely questioned and sometimes I wonder if not rightly so.

Just because we will not have ballots for election of officers does not mean you will be deprived of exercising your franchise. There was a motion made at the February meeting to amend the By-Laws. Copies of the proposed By-Laws as amended were distributed at the February meeting. Copies of these will also be available at



the March meeting, if you want to examine them before you vote. If you have any questions you would like to discuss, call Sy Liebergot. Sy, as one of the chief authors of the proposed changes, has agreed to ruminate on any subject contained therein. Anne Benefield discusses the evolution of these proposed By-Law amendments below. The By-Laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of approval if at least one hundred members and two officers are present.

You still have a chance to do some spring skiing. When you receive the **SitzMarke** there will still be three ski

trips, Purgatory, Reno/Mammoth and Sun Valley. These trips all had some openings as of the February meeting. Both the Reno/Mammoth and the Sun Valley trip have been significantly reduced in price, as indicated by ads elsewhere in the SitzMarke.

Finally, one other matter has come to mind, the picture used for the Head of the Liftline column, I believe it should be known that the Vice President of Publications chooses the picture with no veto power given to the President. An attorney was consulted and he indicated that the First Amendment free speech safeguards apply to pictures as well as words unless they are obscene (some of these pictures are bordering on obscene). Therefore, I have no control over what pictures will be used; however, in a twist of fate. this year's Vice President of Publications will be next year's President. A cache of lascivious pictures has been uncovered and will be gladly furnished to next year's Vice President of Publications.

REPORT FROM THE BOARD

BY-LAWS UPDATE PROPOSED

Last May, a committee was appointed by the Board of Directors to update the Club's By-Laws and Standing Rules both in structure and in content. Generally, the By-Laws and Standing Rules were reorganized into a more logical order and updated to reflect present and recommended operating procedures, especially in the area of the Executive Committee. Highlights of the proposed changes are listed below.

The proposed By-Laws and Standing Rules were presented to the Board of Directors for their review at their quarterly meeting on February 7. The amended Standing Rules were adopted by the Board dependent upon the adoption of the proposed By-Laws by the general membership.

At the subsequent February General Meeting, a motion to adopt these proposed By-Laws as recommended by the Board of Directors was made and seconded. These changes shall be discussed and voted on at the March Annual Meeting. Copies of the proposed By-Laws were available at the February Meeting and will be available at the March Annual Meeting.

Committee members were Chairman Sy Liebergot, Gene Turboff, Ray Hodge and Keith Eastin. Our thanks to you for your many hours of hard work.

Highlights of By-Law Changes:

- 2.6 (B) Allows membership limitation to increase beyond 1400 for new spouses in addition to those wishing to go on ski trips.
- 2.7 Defines "member in good standing" to include one ski trip every 3 years.
- 3.2 Adds the Directors of Trips to the Executive Committee. This is de facto and will encourage participation by the Directors of Trips.
- 3.2 (C.2) Adds the Activity Coordinator (Non ski activities) to Executive Committee appointments.

- 4.3 Requires candidates for president to be a past or present Executive Committee officer.
- 4.5 Changes "at least one nominee" to







Party. Where did you leave your badge Elaine?



TEXAS SKI WEEK RACES

Space City Ski Club stormed the Texas Ski Week with 323 regular forces and enlistees for its largest muster ever. The week began with **Bob Beattie** of NASTAR deciding that Coors (TSW sponsor) could not appear on the bibs of a NASTAR race. Consequently, the medal winners will receive a TEX-STAR medal as soon as they are minted. To add to our problems, someone stole the Texas Ski Cup. It reappeared before the trophy presentation but it was badly damaged.

On Thursday SCSC ran a record 232 racers through the gates for the Texas Ski Cup Race. Our club scored a total of 3306 points including 7 silver and 16 bronze medals. Our fastest man and woman were Mike Dziuba (19.76 sec.) and Pat Tyler (23.96 sec.). Other medal winners were Sy Liebergot, Harry Gaston, John Cook, John Macdonald, Fred Kahrs, John Terzakis and George Hirasaki with silver medals and Donna Berglund, Bob Copple, Bob Fried, Karl Gautschi, Steve Gucker. Bob Marwin, Stan Ferguson, Gary Elston, Marty Matras, Rick McFarland, Ira Sanborn, Doug Van Dorsten, Tom Wright, Tom Mercer and Leona Schroeder with bronze medals.

The spirit of the SCSC racers was exempilfied by **Bette Werlin**. She took on every challange that the race course had to offer for 183 seconds to bring home one point for the Club.

Our heroic efforts were not sufficient to regain the Texas Ski Cup from the University of Texas. They ran 292 racers through the gates (to our 252) to gain a total of 3971 points (to our 3306). A one second difference in par time set by the pacesetter may have helped them also. Their numbers in the top points (compared to ours) are as follows: silver - 5 (SCSC - 7); bronze -22 (SCSC - 16), and 25 points-55 (SCSC - 38). Whippersnappers!

The race for the top three men and women at Texas Ski Week was held on Saturday. The SCSC racers were Sherry Lewis (42.84), Leslie Terzakis (43.64), Shirley Andries (44.44), Leona Schroeder (47.30), Katie Terzakis (48.29), Doug Van Dorsten (36.64), George Hirasaki (37.14), John Terzakis (37.96), Sy Liebergot (39.77), and Gary Elston (DQ). The winning times were 37.43 for the women and 31.48 for the men. Sherry Lewis was 7th fastest female. Doug Van Dorsten was 12th fastest male.
