



Try the **Rainbow Lodge** for atmosphere. This fairly new restaurant has received very little publicity but word of mouth advertising has made reservations a must.


Located on Buffalo Bayou at No. 1 Birdsall (turn at the Steak 'n Ale on Memorial Drive), the Rainbow Lodge is a 'country house' serving veal, fresh fish, pheasant and limited number of other goodies in the \$10 price range. Homemade soups, salads and desserts are recommended and spring forth from a well equipped kitchen.

Lunch is more reasonable with sandwiches and salads in the \$3 range. Great for a romantic weekend afternoon. Fresh strawberry smoothies are also available in addition to a complete bar.

The dining area is split level overlooking a well kept lawn and stream, both of which meander down to the bayou. The dining room is decorated with near antique tables and chairs and the lodge even claims a few hunting trophies which adorn the walls. This sophistication is only enhanced by the expensive automobiles left in the drive by the parking attendants.

The Rainbow Lodge is open Wednesday through Sunday for lunch and dinner. Do remember to call ahead: 861-9407.


