



The Texas International chartered jet flight to Grand Junction will depart Houston's Intercontinental Airport Friday night, January 28th. Please be at the airport by 8:00 P.M. The time for the Taos trip is approaching quickly, and many would-be spring skiers will be left in sunny Houston on that March weekend.

For those of you that attended the meeting and saw the movie on Taos, one item that was not mentioned is the expansion of intermediate and beginners runs that has taken place since the last train load of skiers arrived at Taos. Since the filming of that movie, several long runs skiable by beginner and novice skiers have been added to the mountain. What Taos does not have - lift lines - is probably as important as the runs themselves or the snow. There are many lines which are free to wait in and one is not charged 8 or 9 dollars for the privilege.

Final arrangements for lodging have been completed and for those who are familiar with Taos, we will be staying at the Kandahar Condominiums. "Fixins" for breakfast will be included in the price of the trip. Evening meal arrangements will be made with the lodges in the valley. 

RULES OF THE SLOPES

1. All skiers shall ski under control. Control shall mean in such a manner that a skier can avoid other skiers or objects.

2. When skiing downhill and overtaking another skier, the overtaking skier shall avoid the skier below him.

3. Skiers approaching each other on opposite traverses pass to the right.

4. Skiers shall not stop in a location which will obstruct a trail or stop where they are not visible from above or impede the normal passage of other skiers when loading or unloading.

5. A skier entering a trail or slope from a side or intersecting trail shall first check for approaching downhill skiers.

6. A standing skier shall check for approaching downhill skiers before starting.

7. When walking or climbing in a ski area, skis should be worn and the climber or walker shall keep to the side of the trail or slope.

8. All skiers shall wear safety straps or other devices to prevent runaway skis.

9. Skiers shall keep off closed trails and posted areas and shall observe all traffic signs and other regulations as prescribed by the ski area.


SKI TIPS

There is a problem that afflicts both the new skier trying to become an intermediate skier and the intermediate skier trying for parallel. It is a matter of balance, or "Natural Positioning" as the instructor will refer to it. I like to call it getting the "Center of Gravity" properly fixed on the ski.

In the completion of a turn the average skier has a tendency to get the center of gravity on the uphill side rather than balanced more on the turning ski and away from the hill. The student has devised many forms of trickery to achieve this mistake. We instructors have devised as many exercises to correct these mistakes.

Two of the most common errors are angling the upper body into the hill and an extreme pushing of the hip into the hill. This has the effect of putting the center of gravity uphill. The beginner has difficulty in turning properly because the ski he needs to stem for the next turn is already weighted and he



cannot stem it. The intermediate finds his ski (downhill) keeps separating and he can't turn parallel because he has to make an extra step.

A good exercise is sideslipping. Standing in a proper traverse position (with more weight balanced on the downhill ski) and the upper body angled downhill, push both knees towards downhill to flatten the ski until they start to slide sideways. Maintain the balance on the downhill ski with the upper body still angled away from the hill. To stop the side slip, merely push the knees back into the hill. This will teach you the proper balance as the ski slips. Dues for SCSC membership are \$10.00 for singles; \$15.00 for marrieds. 

RMD NEWS Texas Ski Council

The Rocky Mountain Division is one of nine divisions of the U. S. Ski Association, and it is further divided into special interest groups and geographical sections to better serve the interests of all skiers on a local basis. The Texas Ski Council (TSC) is such a division. It is organized to provide two functions: help the RMD meet the requirements of Texas skiers and provide coordination among Texas ski clubs.

President of the TSC is Ron Crossman, one of Space City's past presidents and chairman of the TSC European ski trip. Ron has been active in the RMD for two years now, serving on the Board of Directors of the RMD and as president of TSC.

The purpose of the TSC is to assist Texas clubs in getting greater ski benefits for their members. Two examples of this are the European ski trip and

aircraft sharing on the Aspen trip.

In previous years, Space City has had difficulty in offering a European trip because of limited interest. Every few years, enough people would be interested in skiing Europe to get a trip together, but in intervening years a lot of people would be disappointed. By joining together with Austin, Dallas, Fort Worth and other Texas skiers, we can consistently provide a trip for our members, and we are able to get the best possible price for our trips.

At a TSC meeting in Dallas, Jerry Chiles was able to initiate a plan with Roger Beasley, president of Austin skiers, to share aircraft on the February Aspen trip to reduce flying costs considerably. (The two clubs' trips are on successive weeks and the plane that takes the second group up will bring the first group back, eliminating deadhead charges). This produces a direct benefit to both clubs and represents only the beginning. There are many other such advantages to be gained

by joining with other clubs to give us much greater bargaining power with airlines, bus companies and lodges for future trips.

These things don't just happen. They are the result of efforts by people like Ron and Jerry and others who travel all over the state and give up weekends and evenings to work out these activities. I urge you to help these people help you by joining the RMD and giving Space City a strong voice in RMD and TSC activities.
