Would you like to have a stronger voice in the skiing industry? How would you like to be able to influence how a ski area is run, the length of lift lines, control of safety factors and the many other things that might bug you?

You have an excellent chance by joining the Rocky Mountain Division of the United States Ski Association through the Space City Ski Club. With a large percentage of our membership in RMD our club can exercise a great deal of influence in the affairs of a nationally recognized skiing organization.

We are interested in seeing RMD become more involved in recreational advantages for the skier. One example is an effort to influence ski areas to offer half day tickets good for mornings rather than afternoon. Since we stop skiing at noon on many of our trips, this would be a good savings for our members.

This suggestion was heartily agreed upon at an RMD meeting.

Join the RMD and tell them what you want! Help make your influence felt by joining RMD for only a \$5.00 membership fee at the next meeting. Skiing Parallel No Longer In Vogue

What are the disadvantages of the GLM method? The first is that it teaches a pure parallel technique. "But I thought that was how you were supposed to ski," you ask. This is no longer true. There have been a lot of developments in equipment and techniques. Skiing pure parallel is no longer considered in vogue, and in some instances can be downright dangerous.

Another disadvantage is the student may progress a little faster in the early stages of learning, but he finds it especially difficult to go beyond a low intermediate level. The student who takes only a couple of lessons in GLM will develop such bad habits they become almost impossible to break.

### Skiing Parallel Not a Technique But: A Style.

As our technique improves, we can advance our style by getting our skis closer together. You need to learn the basics of what makes the skis react and how to handle the skis on all types of terrain. Your legs operate independently of each other just as your arms do. We utilize one ski or the other and sometimes both for balance and turning forces. The weight may be on the downhill ski, uphill ski, or both skis, forward or back depending upon the terrain and what we want the skis to do.

Both the Professional Ski Instructors of America and the Rocky Mountain Ski Instructors Association have rejected the GLM method. They have adopted the accelerated Teaching Method. It advocates starting on 150 Cm skis (GLM starts on 100Cm) and progresses to your normal length. ATM does not emphasize pure parallel. If you have a choice at the ski area, I suggest the ATM. Next month I will discuss the ATM.







GTA reserves the right with or without notice to make changes in transportation or lodging as GTA determines to be necessary.

No notice of cancellation shall be valid unless forwarded to GTA by certified mail, return receipt requested. In the event of such a cancellation notice being received by GTA prior to sixty (60) days before the designated departure date, a refund will be made less a \$10.00 service fee. If a cancellation request is received by GTA less than sixty (60) days prior to departure and a substitute passenger is available who has paid the tour price in full, a refund will be made only if such substitute meets all eligibility, legal, airline, transportation and lodging requirements. In this event a refund will be made less a \$35.00 service fee.
