We gained some experience in the workings of the convention that will be of benefit to the club in the future.

The Division in the past has been primarily a competition oriented organization. There has been a large influence for racing competition and promoting competition amoung the junior racers. However, in the past two years there has been a campaign to get membership from the recreational skier as well. The division no longer is primarily a racing organization. There does exist a difference of opinion between the race oriented clubs and the recreation clubs as to what the future course of the Division shall take.

The election of officers was a very close one. The new President was elected by a margin of two votes. We supported the defeated president as he was recreational oriented and the elected president is more race oriented. However, we and the other recreational

clubs made an impact on the convention, and I believe the future programs of the Division will include the benefit of the recreational skier. I received a personal letter from the new president stating he was very much interested in this area.

The number of our members who belong is another factor in our strength at the convention. The Association can get benefits for you as a member and every skier should belong.


