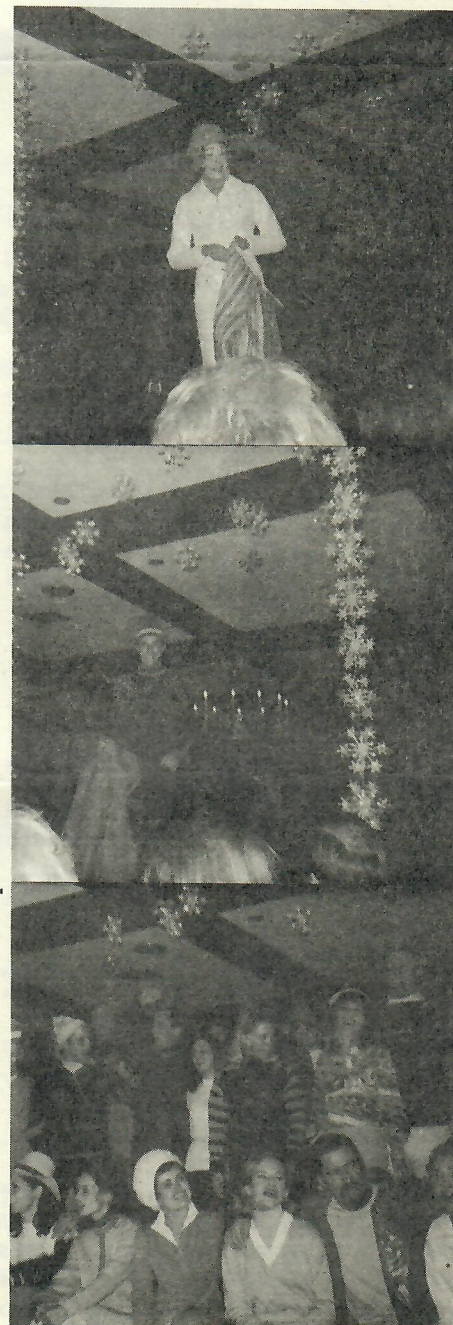

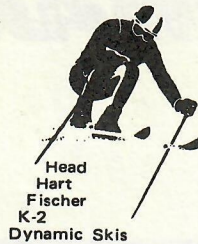
## FROM THE HEAD OF THE 1970-1971 LIFT LINE ...

Thanks also to Kirsten "Kit" Van Cleave for her professional handling of the mobile spotlight which showed off the fashions to such advantage.

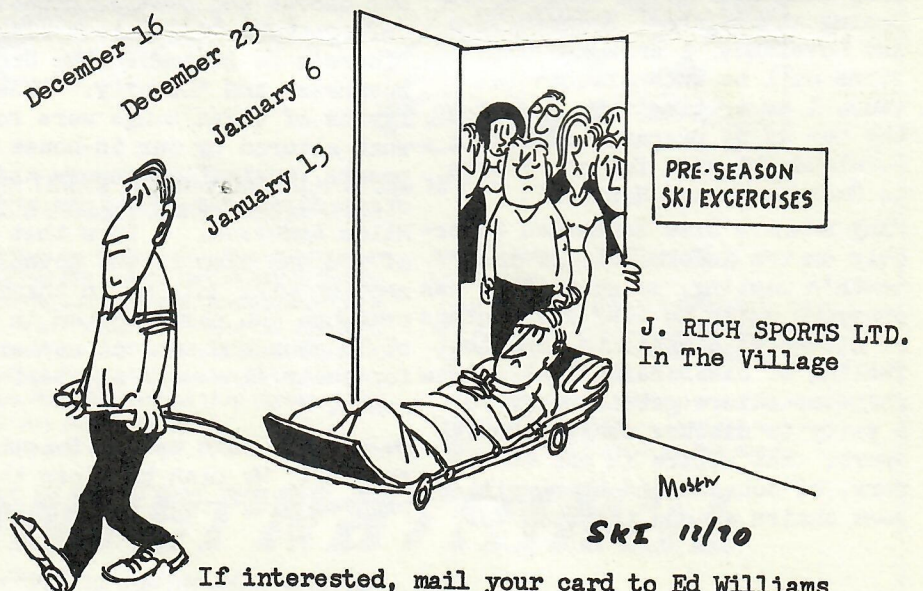
