SKI TIPS

Association and a senior ski instructor at Taos Ski Valley the past three years, I feel qualified to give you advice.

My first advice is to take instruction from a qualified instructor rather than from a well-meaning friend. The friend may be a good skier, but unless he has professional training, he can do you more harm than good. The certified instructor has to pass a difficult examination that tests his ability to ski, his knowledge of the physics and bio-mechanics of skiing, and his ability to demonstrate to and correct a student.

I have heard many novice skiers say they would like to learn to ski or improve their skiing, but they also would like to skip the snowplow or some other stage in the progression of instruction and get right down to parallel skiing. The progression of instruction is to make certain unnatural positions used in skiing, natural to the skiier. The snowplow is not merely for the purpose of slowing down the speed of the beginner. It also teaches a principle known as angulation.

In future issues I hope to talk about some of the principles of skiing and explain some of the words you will hear your instructor use this winter. The very best advice I can give you at this time is to get into good physical condition. You will enjoy your ski trip more.
