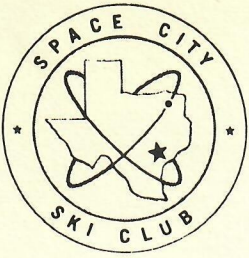

Those of you who are renting equipment and have not given us your shoe size, height and weight please do so immediately.

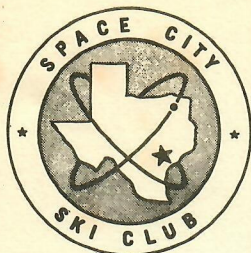
This is final notice to state your preference for room assignments. After the party final assignments will be made by the committee.

ASPEN SKI TRIP INFORMATION

February 5-12, 1966

Dear Member:

The officers of the Space City Ski Club have organized the following schedule and itinerary for a week's skiing in Aspen, Colorado, February 5-12, 1966. In order to benefit from economic rates on transportation, lodging, etc., we need a maximum number of club members to go along. Plans are presently made for:

TRANSPORTATION

Leave Houston by Chartered airplane at 5:00 AM, Saturday, February 5, 1966. A first class breakfast and beverages will be served on the flight. Upon arrival in Grand Junction buses will be waiting at the airport to take us immediately to Aspen. Arrival time in Aspen will be approximately noon. Departure time from Aspen will be late afternoon Saturday, February 12, for Grand Junction. We will fly back to Houston and again dinner and drinks will be served. Arrival in Houston will be early Sunday morning, February 13.

LODGING

We have confirmed reservations for up to ninety (90) people at the Continental Inn in Aspen. The Continental is a few steps from the Aspen Mt. lifts and the Red Onion and has everything necessary for a fine week of frivolity - bar and restaurant, lounge with fireplace, heated pool, and Sauna. Our accommodations are in the new wing. There is one spacious room for eight with two baths, six rooms for six, eight rooms for four and a limited number of rooms for three and two. Married couples will have first call on the two's.

COST

Round trip transportation including buses from Houston-Grand Junction-Aspen-Grand Junction-Houston based on ninety (90) people is \$92.60 per person. The airplane will hold 103 people. Lodging cost per person for seven nights is \$44.10 for four, six, or eight in a room, \$51.45 for three, and \$66.15 for two. A deposit of \$50 per person is required to confirm our airplane and hold the hotel accommodations. We must have your deposit by December 1, 1965. This deposit is refundable until January 1, 1966, if necessary, but after that time it is still transferable to some other person.

SKI RENTALS AND TOW TICKETS

Skis, boots and poles are available for rent at a nominal cost---approximately \$25-\$30 per week. Lift tickets for the week will cost \$35-\$45. Three days of lessons (which is recommended as a minimum for those who have never or seldom skied) is \$20. There are various deals on combined lessons and lift tickets. Of course this Aspen Ski Trip is open only to members of the Space City Ski Club. We welcome anyone who wants to join our club and go along to Aspen with us. Let's all make plans NOW to spend one of the best week's vacation of your whole life. Round up your friends and let's go skiing! 1. Check out of Motel rooms before skiing. Luggage may be left in lobby. Buses will load at 5:00 sharp. Make certain you have turned in your rented equipment by 4:30. Departure time from Grand Junction will be approximately 9:00 P.M. Arrival in Houston approximately 1:30 A.M. (C.S.T.)
2. "Last Blast" Wine and Cheese Party at Aspen Mountain. All should try to attend. Time and place will be posted on the bulletin board.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Check bulletin boards in the lobby regularly for additional activities or possible changes. We urge everyone to attend all scheduled events.

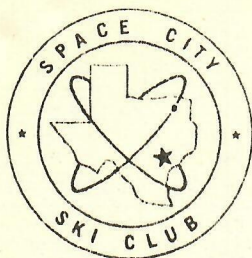
Ski club pins will be available for purchase on the plane going up. Cost \$3.50 each.

During this time of year all night clubs and restaurants will be extremely crowded. Either make reservations in advance or allow plenty of time for eating.

Clothing - Dress for the weather; it's cold in Aspen. Informal sports and ski wear is the rule. Slacks are okay everywhere (even church). Dresses and heels and coat and tie are not necessary. After-ski boots with non-slip soles are a must for comfort. Dress on the plane is casual, too.

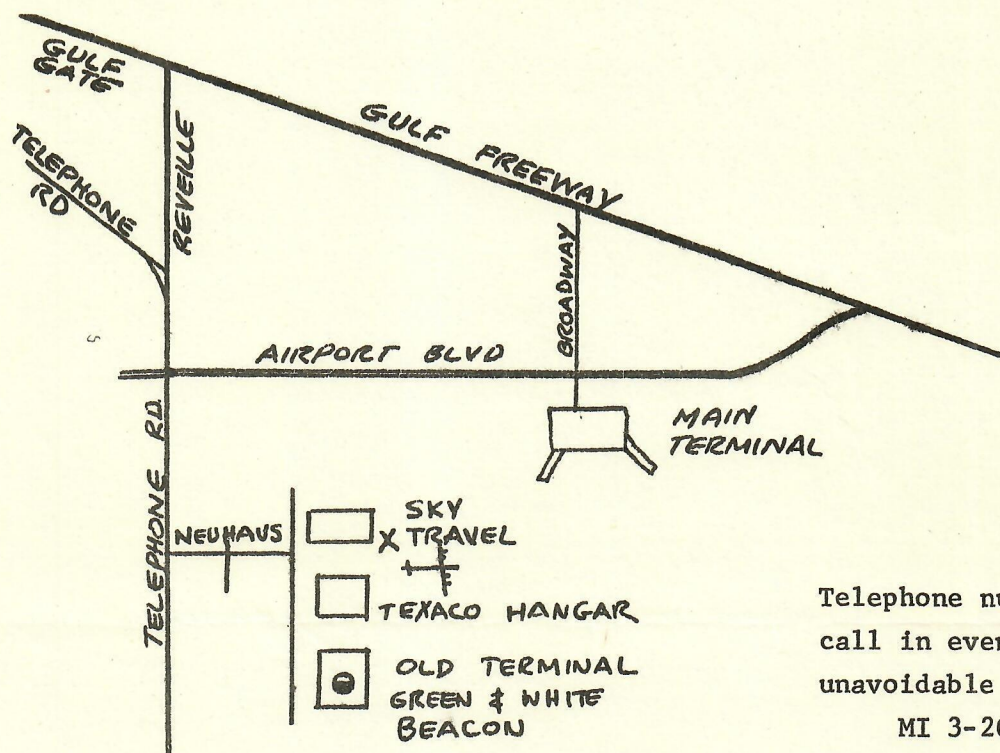
ITINERARY

1. Departure from SKY TRAVEL, INC., next to Texaco hangar and old terminal building at International Airport. Check in time 4:30 A.M. Flight leaves 5:00 A.M. sharp! Limit on luggage; two bags, total weight not to exceed 45 lbs., excluding skis, boots and poles. People should double up as much as possible in cars going out to Airport.

Porters will check baggage and there is limited free parking near terminal. LOCK YOUR CAR.

2. Breakfast will be served during the 3 1/2 hour flight from Houston to Grand Junction. We will arrive at the Municipal Airport in Grand Junction at approximately 7:30 A.M. (Mountain Standard Time) at which time we will board buses and go immediately to Aspen. Arrival in Aspen is scheduled for approximately 11:30 A.M. Upon arrival in Aspen first check in at The Continental Inn and then go to the ski rental shop and pick up your equipment. Persons who gave us sizes have equipment reserved at Aspen Sports.

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 6

1. Church services held at times convenient for skiers.
2. All people interested in enrolling in ski school report at 9:00 A.M. at Aspen Ski School meeting place. See Instructor for lessons and proper tow tickets. We recommend that all beginners take at least three days of lessons.

MONDAY, FEBRUARY 7

Wine and Cheese Luncheon at Buttermilk Mountain. Time and place will be posted on the bulletin board. (See General Information)

ACCOMMODATIONS
